FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Blessed Are The Peacemakers – Let Us Open Wide Our Hearts"

Dear Friends,

Last week we reflected on the Beatitude, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." (Mt 5,9) I think it would be worth our while to consider it again, in light of all of the violence and unrest that is going on around us.

Let us begin with a close reading of St. Thomas's definition of peace: "Peace is the tranquility of order. Now, order is the arrangement allotting the proper place to equals and unequals. Therefore peace resides in this, that all hold their own places. Hence the mind of man ought, **first**, to be subject to God. **Second**, the motions and inferior powers which are common to us and animals should be subject to man, for man has dominion over the animals by reason; let us make man to our image and likeness (Gen 1:26). **Third**, that a man have peace toward others, because thus he will be entirely ordered."

Man cannot forget about God, lest he be tempted to place himself above his brother, who is his equal. Man cannot forget about himself, for when he loses sight of his true dignity – endowed with a spiritual soul that has understanding and a free will – he will allow himself to be dominated by his passions and not right reason. And the fruit of such order is peace towards others.

As the USCCB has pointed out, racism is a rupture of this right order, stating, "racism occurs because a person ignores the fundamental truth that, because all humans share a common origin, they are all brothers and sisters, all equally made in the image of God. In these and in many other such acts, the sin of racism persists in our lives, in our country, and in our world." It seems that the attempts to end such a disordering of the truth that racism incurs upon our lives have always been partial or ephemeral. Why is it?

Might it also be the case that the root causes are so hard to address collectively? In other words, it demands a real commitment to the Gospel by each one of us. "To press forward without fear means "to walk humbly with God" in rebuilding our relationships, healing our communities, and working to shape our policies and institutions toward the good of all, as missionary disciples." (USCCB, *Letter against Racism*)

The Beatitudes point to the path of true order and discipleship. Fr. Jacques Philippe has a nice summary of how the Beatitudes are like steps to peace and that we must incorporate them all. Here is the summary in full:

"Poverty of heart. Without this virtue, one can never be at peace and always in conflict with ourselves or others. Attachment to riches, whether material, moral or spiritual, will always be a source of worry. The poor in heart are supported entirely by God, have nothing to defend, nothing to lose, nothing to conquer. And so they find peace. Humility leads to peace, while pride is one of the worst enemies of interior peace.

Tears and consolation. Someone who has gone through trials and tasted divine consolation receives the grace of peace that can be shared with others.

Meekness. Gospel meekness, the renunciation of violence, bitterness, and anger, obviously leads to peace.

Hunger and thirst for justice. Those who seek the justice of the Kingdom will be filled and therefore at peace: "Great peace have those who love thy law."

Mercy. One who is merciful will find peace, while someone who doesn't forgive will never be at peace.

Purity of heart. One who loves with a true and disinterested love will find peace, while someone who seeks his or her own satisfaction will never be satisfied or peaceful." (*The Eight Doors of the Kingdom*, p.182-83)

Phillippe continues on to say that this is a true and urgent calling addressed to us by God and that we cannot expect to or hope to transmit peace unless we have it in our hearts. He says, in fact, this is our first duty as Christians. "The first duty of a Christian is not to be perfect or resolve all problems, but to be at peace. . . . For hearts not truly at peace in God, hearts ruled by fear or defense mechanisms and abruptly plunged into situations filled with evil, violence, hate, and division, where social pressures are mounting—such hearts, I Say, are unable to resist doing evil themselves. There are times when the existence of a good moral code is by itself not enough." It demands peacemakers, that is, ordered Christians.

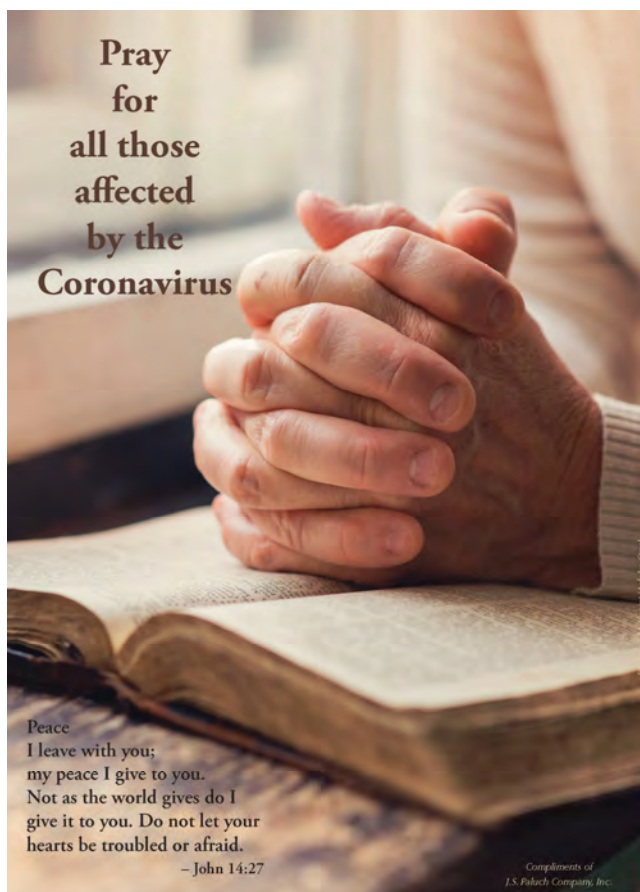

What is a Spiritual Communion?

St. Thomas Aquinas once defined Spiritual Communion as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament and in lovingly embracing Him as if we had actually received Him." You just need to approach Him with sincerity, humility and a desire to follow in His footsteps in acts of faith and charity. St. Jean-Marie Vianney, a French priest famous for converting countless souls to Christ in his parish of Ars in the 19th century, once said "when we feel the love of God growing cold, let us instantly make a Spiritual Communion. When we cannot go to the church, let us turn towards the tabernacle; no wall can shut us out from the good God."

PARISH REGISTRATION

Are You a Registered Parishioner?

If you attend Mass here regularly, we encourage you to register as a parishioner of Our Lady of Peace parish.

Why registering is important:

1. If we as a parish do not know who is out there, how can we serve the needs of all?

This includes single people or young families who may not see the need to register.

2. Make Sacrament prep easier when the time comes.

If you're not a registered parishioner, this may greatly delay the process for Sacrament prep.

3. Letters of Recommendation

There are occasions where letters of recommendations

are needed from your parish pastor (ie Catholic school enrollment, scholarships, godparent eligibility, etc.). If you're not registered, we cannot provide this letter.

Anyone, regardless of where they live is welcome to register at OLOP.

Please note: there is a three (3) month waiting period from the date of registration before being considered a full-fledged registered parishioner. Any requests for pastor signatures on any forms, letters, or wedding preparation paperwork cannot not be processed within the 3 months.

Disaster Relief Assistance for Immigrants Program (DRAI)

Key Facts

- *Program period:* **Monday, May 18 to June 30, 2020**
- *Days of operation:* **Monday through Saturday**
- *Hours of Hotline:* **8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.**

What is the DRAI program?

- The State of California will provide one-time disaster relief assistance to adult undocumented immigrant adults over the age of 18 who have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- This program is funded by the State of California.
- The program is for adults who are ineligible for other forms of federal unemployment or pandemic related assistance, such as the CARES act or unemployment benefits.

What do I need to do to apply?

- The first step is to **CALL 866-490-3899**.
- You must provide a photo ID with a Santa Clara County address.

How much is the assistance?

- An undocumented adult who qualifies will receive \$500 of direct cash assistance (maximum of \$1000 per household). A household is defined as individuals who live, purchase, and prepare meals together.
- Assistance will be provided on a first come, first serve basis. Disaster relief application services and assistance are not guaranteed.

Behavioral Health Services

As numbers of cases of COVID-19 increase, so does the associated anxiety, feelings of fear and uncertainty, and other mental health concerns around the developing situation.
