FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Conversations On Culture: Know Your Surroundings

Dear Friends,

I would like to set out, for a few weeks (more or less) to reflect for a while on the world "culture." I realize that this is a very broad topic, one that touches many different aspects of our lives. It is for this reason—touching all areas of our lives—that I think that it is worthwhile to have an awareness of culture. What is culture? How important is culture? Are we going through a cultural revolution or have we been for some time? Or you may even ask yourself, why is this important for me?

Well, first I would simply appeal to the rule of common sense: "It's good to know your surroundings." This seems to be the basic rule present a number of any rules for personal safety. Maintaining good awareness of your surroundings helps you and your family stay safe. The work of understanding culture and identifying one's own culture is very similar to this rule of basic safety. Know your surroundings. Moreover, staying safe is usually seen from the negative perspective, that is, avoiding harm. It can also mean thriving or ability to go about things naturally. Culture should help us thrive as human beings. As Jesus explains in the Parable of the Sower, the seed of true love will only grow in a certain "soil." (Mt 13:1-23)

The word culture is generally taken to mean any arranged environment to facilitate growth. Take for example the word "agriculture," which is really the cultivation of fields, which derives from the Latin *cultus*, which means essentially anything conquered. In this way, culture is anything subjugated, made tame or ordered under a rule. In this way, a field that has been *cultivated* is one that is subjugated to the rule of order that the farmer applies to facilitate the growth of crops; it is no longer wild.

To help human nature blossom, one should take into account things that are, well, human. the physical, moral and spiritual soil in which human beings grow." Man, with his load of sin and disorder, certainly needs a subjugating and taming influence to attain to human fullness. What Senior thus expresses in his own way is now classical doctrine. St. Pope John Paul II has said: "Culture is that through which man, as man, becomes more man, "is" more, has access to more being. . . . All man's "having" is important for culture, is a factor of culture, only to the extent to which man, through his having, can at the same time "be" more fully a man, become more fully man in all the diversity of his existence, in everything that characterizes his humanity." (June 2, 1979)

Then-Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger explains that culture is "an attempt to understand the world and the existence of man within it. . . . This understanding is meant to show us how to go about being human." (*Truth and Tolerance, Christian Belief and World Religions*, 60)

A classics professor, John Senior, from the University of Kansas once wrote, "Our Lord explains in the Parable of the Sower that the seed of His love will only grow in a certain soil—and that is the soil of Christian Culture, which is the work of music in the wide sense, including as well as tunes that are sung, art, literature, games, architecture—all so many instruments in the orchestra which plays day and night the music of lovers; and if it is disordered, then the love of Christ will not grow. It is an obvious matter of fact that here in the United States now, the Devil has seized these instruments to play a *dance macabre*, a dance of death, especially through what we call the "media," the film, television, radio, record, book, magazine and newspaper industries. The restoration of culture, spiritually, morally, physically, demands the cultivation of the soil in which the love of Christ can grow, and that means we must, as they say, rethink priorities."

To grow in our humanity, we require an environment that most of all cultivates our relationship to the great, fundamental truths, truths that ultimately give meaning to life, truths that pertain to God the Creator of all, Truth in Person. Man's intellect and will cannot be satisfied with anything less than a personal relationship with God. In other words, culture should mostly help men grow in their humanity by submitting them to God's rule. Or if we can put it another way, obedient to reality, i.e., the root word for obedience ob – audire – literally means to listen intently or we can say "wrapt in listening" to reality.

This is just a sort of introductory smattering of reflections. It is my hope to get into some of the fundamental areas of culture, our current culture, the inculturation of the Gospel, and anything else that may come up. For how long? Who knows? I just wanted to start the conversation. May our Lady, Queen of Peace, guide us along the path.

MASS INTENTION REQUESTS

The calendar is currently open for Mass intention requests for the month of November! We plan to open the Mass intentions book for the month of December on Tuesday, November 10th. (Please continue to check for updates as we adapt to new changes).

Please follow the **temporary** process listed below.

Although the parish office is closed to drop-in visitors, we have instituted a temporary process to accept and process Mass Intention requests via email. The normal Mass Intention guidelines listed below still apply, including the 25 character limit.

Mass Intention request requirements:

- Donation of \$10 per Mass
- Up to two (2) separate Masses that do not occur in the same week may be requested
- Each Mass may only have 2 names with a limit of 25 characters (including spaces) per Mass request, and only one intention option chosen (Birthday, Death Anniversary, Health, Special Intentions, Thanksgiving, or Wedding Anniversary). Please remember to note if the request is for someone living or deceased.
- No changes can be made once the requests have been placed into the calendar.
- No holds or reservations will be accepted. No exceptions can be made.

In order to request a Mass Intention during this shelter-in time, please carefully follow the steps below:

1. First, please send an email with your full name, phone number, Mass Intention request text (limit 25 characters), and preferred date/time to mass@olop-shrine.org. Please refer to the Mass Intention Requests form above to see what details you will need to provide.
2. Once the email is received, our staff will look through the calendar for availability. Until the intention request is finalized by a confirmation reply email from our staff, the intention is not considered entered in the calendar.
3. If there is a time conflict with the requested date/time, our staff member will call you from a private number to arrange an alternative date and time. You will also receive a call if there are any changes needed to the request.
4. The confirmation email will give a link indicating how to submit your Mass Intention request donation online.

Masks are required on the property. Thank you for doing your part in protecting the health of our community.

Mass Inside the Church: Please form a line before Mass begins. Please follow the instructions of the volunteer ushers who will be helping direct you to your places. You are encouraged to bring your own chairs if sitting outside.

- Once you have chosen to sit in the church or outside and entered the area, you will not be permitted to leave to switch locations.
- You will be instructed to maintain a social distance between the households (6ft). The pews have been marked to provide a visual aid for distance.
- Children must always remain under the close supervision of parents/family at all times.
- Dress warmly in case indoor seating has filled up.
- There is no reservation system for indoor Mass.

Mass in the parking lot: The only entrance/exit will be from Our Lady's Way. There will be a security guard and volunteers who will direct you to your parking spots.

- Please stay in your vehicles at all times, unless you need to line up for confession or use the restroom. The restrooms that are designated for public use are only in the Family Learning Center.
- We will broadcast the Mass on an FM radio signal (92.9 FM) so that you can follow along from your vehicle.
- Due to county restrictions, Mass is limited to 100 cars only. Holy Communion can only be distributed to those in their vehicles in the parking lot participating in the Mass.
- Please turn on your emergency blinker lights at the appropriate to indicate that you wish to receive Communion, then turn them off afterward.

Adoration is open between Masses with a limit of 100 persons in the church at a time.

You are also welcome to visit the shrine and pray outdoors! For your safety and the safety of others, please try to remain at least 6 feet apart from others and cover all sneezes and coughs.





What is a Spiritual Communion?

St. Thomas Aquinas once defined Spiritual Communion as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament and in lovingly embracing Him as if we had actually received Him." You just need to approach Him with sincerity, humility and a desire to follow in His footsteps in acts of faith and charity. St. Jean-Marie Vianney, a French priest famous for converting countless souls to Christ in his parish of Ars in the 19th century, once said "when we feel the love of God growing cold, let us instantly make a Spiritual Communion. When we cannot go to the church, let us turn towards the tabernacle; no wall can shut us out from the good God."

- Please make sure that all entries include a contact person from the school/parish and appropriate contact numbers
- All entries should be received at the Office of the Bishop no later than November 11, 2020. Upon reception of your entries, you will receive a confirmation email of your participation
- Once the winner has been chosen, parental permission will be sought for the use of the design. All artwork submitted becomes the whole property of the Diocese of San Jose
