

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### *Conversations On Culture: The Ears Of A Musician and Eyes Of A Poet*

Dear Friends,

A culture that would be beneficial to humans would be, according to the Greeks, musical. “Well,” you might ask, “What is a musical culture?” Does that mean a life lived with my favorite playlist perpetually running through my ear buds? My life soundtrack that helps me avoid silence? Sorry, that is not a musical culture.

Well, it would be good to understand the very term music. As I parenthetically mentioned last week, the Greeks used music to civilize the youth. And by music they meant, “whatever activity is under the care of the Muses, that tradition consisting of the arts and skills which we call “arts and letters,” and among these especially poetry and melodic music.” (Brann, Socrates on Music and Poetry) The muses in ancient Greece were considered “the source of the knowledge embodied in the poetry, lyric songs, and myths that were related orally for centuries in ancient Greek culture.”

The muses, in the mind of the wise man Socrates are meant to foster a search for truth or a love of wisdom. Incidentally the word “philosophy” literally means, “love of wisdom.” Therefore, a musical culture ought to lead us philosophical reflection. They should, like a kind of force, impel us to stop and think. Might it be possible that even the small things in life can be striking and worthy of our admiration? For example, a conversation, watching the clouds race by, or appreciating silence.

This is in contrast to those things that appeal to our senses and feelings, these are termed “popular,” which are quick and easy to grasp—no thought required. These would speak more to the imagination and to the emotions than to the will and to the mind. According to classics professors, those books or works of art that are oftentimes categorized as a “Great Book” are able to accomplish both – they stir up the imagination with a great story and they nourish both the mind and the heart. It is sort of like a really wonderful meal that at one and the same time pleases and nourishes. Some authors along these lines would be Shakespeare, Cervantes, and Dante (just to name a few).

Again, just so we are clear, what we are talking about here regarding a musical culture is recovering the art of being, which is typically told through story-telling, poetry, architecture, sculpture, painting and drawing, as well as song, all of which are meant to foster (aid) in our search for truth and love. When we bring these two things together—true and the good—we have something beautiful. Don’t forget about the transcendentals! Great art, great music, great stories, great poetry, these are all things that we need.

In Restoration of a Christian Culture, John Senior writes that Musical reading does not consist in technical analysis of texts, but rather reading on the musical level is “something simple, direct, enjoyable, unreflective, uncritical, spontaneous, free, romantic, if you will, with the full understanding that such experience is not sufficient ... for science and philosophy, but indispensable as the cultural soil of moral, intellectual, and spiritual growth.” Therefore, along these lines a person can begin to see life with a more child-like simplicity, one that is filled with excitement, wonder, and dare I say it, joy, over the ordinary.

I leave you with St. John Henry Newman who articulates this musical/poetical culture that we would do well to cultivate. He does it within the fame of a Benedictine Monastery. We could however, apply this to ourselves as well. For him there is a link between spiritual joy and child-like simplicity:

“And therefore have I called the monastic state the most poetical of religious disciplines. It was a return to that primitive age of the world, of which poets have so often sung, ... when fraud and violence were unknown. It was a bringing back of those real, not fabulous, scenes of innocence and miracle, when Adam delved, or Abel kept sheep, or Noe planted the vine, and Angels visited them. It was a fulfillment in the

All baptized Catholics are required to observe abstinence from meat (age 14 onwards) on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent. Fasting (ages 18-59) is also required on Ash Wednesday, unless grave health concerns prevent them.

**FASTING & ABSTINENCE****Lenten Regulations on Fast and Abstinence**

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older.

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

The special Pascal fast and abstinence are observed on Good Friday, and where possible, Holy Saturday. On these days, Christians prepare themselves by these disciplines in anticipation of the renewal of their baptismal commitment on Easter.

From its earliest days, the Church has urged the baptized and the catechumens to observe the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer as a preparation for the celebration of Easter. Failure to observe individual days of penance is not considered serious, but failure to observe any penitential days at all or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

During Lent, the Church encourages attendance at daily Mass, self-imposed times of fasting, and generosity to local, national, and worldwide programs of sharing.

letter, of the glowing imagery of prophets, about the evangelical period. Nature for art, the wide earth and the majestic heavens for the crowded city, the subdued and docile beasts of the field for the wild passions and rivalries of social life, tranquility for ambition and care, divine meditation for the exploits of the intellect, the Creator for the creature, such was the normal condition of the monk. He had tried the world, and found its hollowness; or he had eluded its fellowship, before it had solicited him;—and so St. Antony fled to the desert, and St. Hilarion sought the sea shore, and St. Basil ascended the mountain ravine, and St. Benedict took refuge in his cave,...in order that the world might be shut out of view, and the soul might be at rest. And such a rest of intellect and of passion as this is full of the elements of the poetical.” (St. John Henry Newman, *The Mission of St. Benedict*)

I ask it through your sorrow and pain of soul when the angel declared to you that the life of the Child Jesus was sought by His enemies. From their evil plan you had to flee with Him and His Blessed Mother to Egypt. I ask it by all the suffering, weariness, and labors of that long and dangerous journey.

I ask it by all your care to protect the Sacred Child and His Immaculate Mother during your second journey, when you were ordered to return to your own country. I

ask it by your peaceful life in Nazareth where you met with so many joys and sorrows.

I ask it by your great distress when the adorable Child was lost to you and His Mother for three days. I ask it by your joy at finding Him in the Temple, and by the comfort you found at Nazareth, while living in the company of the Child Jesus. I ask it by the wonderful submission He showed in His obedience to you.

I ask it by the perfect love and conformity you showed in accepting the Divine order to depart from this life, and from the company of Jesus and Mary. I ask it by the joy which filled your soul, when the Redeemer of the world, triumphant over death and hell, entered into the possession of His kingdom and led you into it with special honors.

I ask it through Mary's glorious Assumption, and through that endless happiness you have with her in the presence of God.

O good father! I beg you, by all your sufferings, sorrows, and joys, to hear me and obtain for me what I ask.



## MASS INTENTION REQUESTS

The calendar is currently open for Mass intention requests for the month of January 2021! (Please continue to check for updates as we adapt to new changes). **Please follow the temporary process listed below.**

Although the parish office is closed to drop-in visitors, we have instituted a temporary process to accept and process Mass Intention requests via email. The normal Mass Intention guidelines listed below apply, including the 25 character limit.

Mass Intention request requirements:

- Donation of \$10 per Mass
- Up to two (2) separate Masses that do not occur in the same week may be requested
- Each Mass may only have 2 names with a limit of 25 characters (including spaces) per Mass request, and only one intention option chosen (Birthday, Death Anniversary, Health, Special Intentions, Thanksgiving, or Wedding Anniversary). Please remember to note if the request is for someone living or deceased.
- No changes can be made once the requests have been placed into the calendar.
- No holds or reservations will be accepted. No exceptions can be made.

In order to request a Mass Intention during this shelter-in time, please carefully follow the steps below:

1. First, please send an email with your full name, phone number, Mass Intention request text (limit 25 characters), and preferred date/time to [mass@olop-shrine.org](mailto:mass@olop-shrine.org). Please refer to the Mass Intention Requests form above to see what details you will need to provide.
2. Once the email is received, our staff will look through the calendar for availability. Until the intention request is finalized by a confirmation reply email from our staff, the intention is not considered entered in the calendar. **Due to the volume of requests, it is best to request a Mass intention at least one week prior to the desired date.**
3. If there is a time conflict with the requested date/time, our staff member will call you to arrange an alternative date and time. You will also receive a call if there are any changes needed to the request.
4. The confirmation email will give a link indicating how to submit your Mass Intention request donation online.
