FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Year of St. Joseph – Ite Ad Joseph!

Dear Friends,

I think to announce some things regarding the Year of St. Joseph and the ensuing Holy Week are worthwhile reasons to put a pause on our ongoing conversation on culture. Please don't forget where we were in our conversation; we were speaking about music, which is where we will pick up in the near future.

In any event, as many of you know we are in the Year of St. Joseph, we are also celebrating our Diocese's 40th Anniversary. Our Bishop Oscar Cantú has marked it as a special jubilee for us. Therefore, we are trying to put some special activities together regarding this extraordinary year—details about some of them are forthcoming.

Two that are most pressing that I would like to draw your attention to are the parish-wide Consecration to St. Joseph and the naming of Pilgrimage Sites for the Year of St. Joseph.

For the first, we will begin on March 30th and will make our consecration on May 1st, the feast of St. Joseph the Worker. We are recommending that you use the recently released book written by Fr. Donald Calloway, MIC titled: Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father. We will livestream the daily reflections each morning and then have talks on Saturday evenings on April 10, 17, and 24 after the 5pm mass.

You can register online at: <u>www.consecrationgroup.org/stjoseph</u>. There is also information in this week's bulletin, which you can access online or at the church entrances.

Also, Our Lady of Peace has been named as a Pilgrimage Site during this year of St. Joseph, which is the 40th Jubilee of the Diocese of San Jose.

In biblical times, jubilees were a time of renewal and hope, of new opportunities and new beginnings. To assist toward the goal of spiritual renewal and recommitment, Bishop Cantú designated 10 pilgrimage sites within our Diocese for the Year of Saint Joseph through December 8, 2021. It is truly a blessing for us to be among them!

The faithful, who visit any of these pilgrimage sites, will gain a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions (a spirit detached from any sin, sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father). For those who are unable to make a visit in person, spiritual or virtual visits may be made by actively participating a livestream Mass from one of these locations with devotion and full attention to the Eucharist.

In addition to these two important announcements, I would also like to take the opportunity to congratulate and thank our sisters, the Servants of the Lord and the Virgin of Matará, who celebrated their 33rd anniversary on March 19, the Solemnity of St. Joseph. They are truly a blessing to our parish and to the church throughout the world, please help us in celebrating with them by praying for them and thanking them for all they do here at our parish. They are truly a blessing for the life of Our Lady of Peace!

I leave you with a few words of wisdom from the saints. In the writings of St. Teresa of Avila we find: "I don't remember praying to St. Joseph for a grace without obtaining it. He who doesn't believe should try praying to him." St. John Bosco used to say, "I never ask St. Joseph for a grace without receiving it."

Therefore, through the intercession of Saint Joseph, today I invite you to ask the Lord for these graces:

- 1) The grace of imitating his interior life. That we may distinguishing oneself in "humble service and generous donation, that is, in the free offering of oneself through love to the extreme" as we set out on this consecration to St. Joseph.
- 2) The fruits of many conversions and a spiritual renewal in the Diocese of San Jose during this time of Jubilee, through the intercession of our mighty patron.
- 3) The paternal and providential protection of the Father who nourishes the Incarnate Word for all the Sisters in all their missions.





Mass in the Church: Please form a line before Mass begins. Please follow the instructions of the volunteer ushers who will be helping direct you to your places.

- You are encouraged to bring your own chairs if sitting outside.
- Please maintain a social distance between the households (6ft).
- Children must always remain under the close supervision of parents/family at all times.
- There is no reservation system for Mass.

Mass in the parking lot: The only entrance/exit will be from Our Lady's Way. There will be a security guard and volunteers who will direct you to your parking spots.

- Please stay in your vehicles at all times, unless you need to line up for confession or use the restroom. The restrooms that are designated for public use are only in the Family Learning Center.
- We will broadcast the Mass on an FM radio signal (92.9 FM) so that you can follow along from your vehicle.
- Due to county restrictions, Mass is limited to 100 cars only. Holy Communion can only be distributed to those in their vehicles in the parking lot participating in the Mass.
- Please turn on your emergency blinker lights at the appropriate to indicate that you wish to receive Communion, then turn them off afterward.

You are also welcome to visit the shrine and pray outdoors! For your safety and the safety of others, please try to remain at least 6 feet apart from others and cover all sneezes and coughs.

I ask it by the loveliness and power of that sacred Name, Jesus, which you conferred on the adorable infant.


I ask it by that painful torture you felt at the prophecy of holy Simeon, which declared the Child Jesus and His holy Mother future victims of our sins and of their great love for us.




FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older. From its earliest days, the Church has urged the baptized and the catechumens to observe the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer as a preparation for the celebration of Easter. Failure to observe individual days of penance is not considered serious, but failure to observe any penitential days at all or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

During Lent, the Church encourages attendance at daily Mass, self-imposed times of fasting, and generosity to local, national, and worldwide programs of sharing.
