FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Passion (Palm) Sunday

Dear Friends,

With this Passion (Palm) Sunday, we enter into the Holiest Weeks of the Liturgical Year. Why do we call this Sunday, *Passion Sunday*? It bears this title, because on this day the Church begins to make the sufferings of our Redeemer her chief thought.

This week is a week in which we focus on and are mindful of the supreme act of love that God carried out for us (you and me). He meticulously planned for this moment. It was His Hour. "The Hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." (Jn 12:23) I pray that you may allow yourself to live this week differently than all other weeks of the year. We enjoy 52 weeks in the year, allow this one to have a special place in which you live immersed in the Paschal Mysteries. What are the Paschal Mysteries? The Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is the hour in which God had so desired to bring about for us. There ought to be a reverence and stillness by which we conduct ourselves and our activities during this week. It is not business as usual, at least not on the inside. Perhaps our daily duties cannot justifiably be altered, nevertheless we can immerse ourselves in the atmosphere of the Passion.

There is a nice description of what I am speaking about that can be found in a Liturgical Classic titled, *The Liturgical Year* by Abbot Dom Guéranger. I would like to quote a significant portion of his explanation on Passion Sunday. He says,

"Everything around us urges us to mourn. The images of the saints, the very crucifix on our altar, are veiled from our sight. The Church is oppressed with grief. During the first four weeks of Lent, she compassionated her Jesus fasting in the desert; His coming sufferings and crucifixion and death are what now fill her with anguish.

We read in today's Gospel, that the Jews threaten to stone the Son of God as a blasphemer: but His hour is not yet come. He is obliged to flee and hide Himself. It is to express this deep humiliation, that the Church veils the cross. A God hiding Himself, that He may evade the anger of men - what a mystery! Is it weakness? Is it, that He fears death? No; we shall soon see Him going out to meet His enemies: but at present He hides Himself from them, because all that had been prophesied regarding Him has not been fulfilled. Besides, His death is not to be by stoning: He is to die upon a cross, the tree of malediction, which, from that time forward, is to be the tree of life.

Let us humble ourselves, as we see the Creator of heaven and earth thus obliged to hide Himself from men, who are bent on His destruction! Let us go back, in thought, to the sad day of the first sin, when Adam and Eve hid themselves because a guilty conscience told them they were naked. Jesus has come to assure us of our being pardoned, and lo! He hides Himself, not because He is naked - He that is to the saints the garb of holiness and immortality - but because He made Himself weak, that He might make us strong. Our first parents sought to hide themselves from the sight of God; Jesus hides Himself from the eye of men. But it will not be thus forever. The day will come when sinners, from whose anger He now flees, will pray to the mountains to fall on them and shield them from His gaze; but their prayer will not be granted, and they shall see the Son of Man coming in the clouds of heaven, with much power and majesty [St. Matt. xxiv. 30]." (Dom Prosper Guéranger, *The Liturgical Year*, Passiontide and Holy Week)

Please take a look at the Holy Week activities and try to take advantage of this moment. I pray that all of you may have a Holy Week that is filled with grace and devotion. And please keep our Catechumens and Candidates as they are just days away from being fully united to Christ and the Church through the sacraments of Christian Initiation.

Mary, Our Lady of Peace, pray for us!

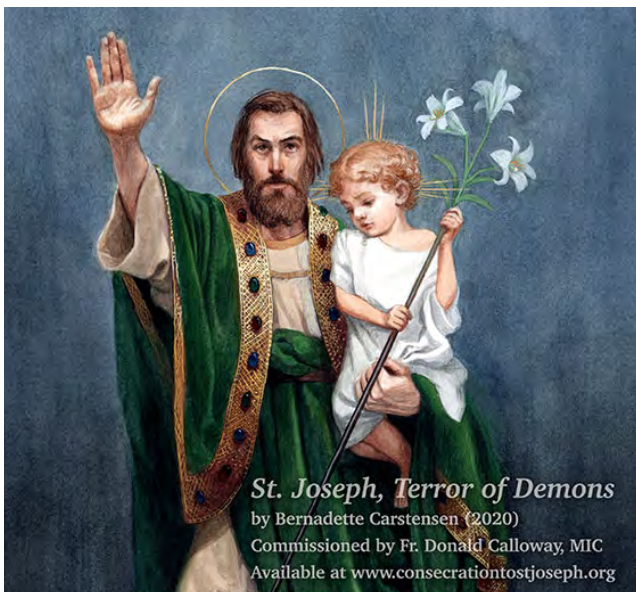

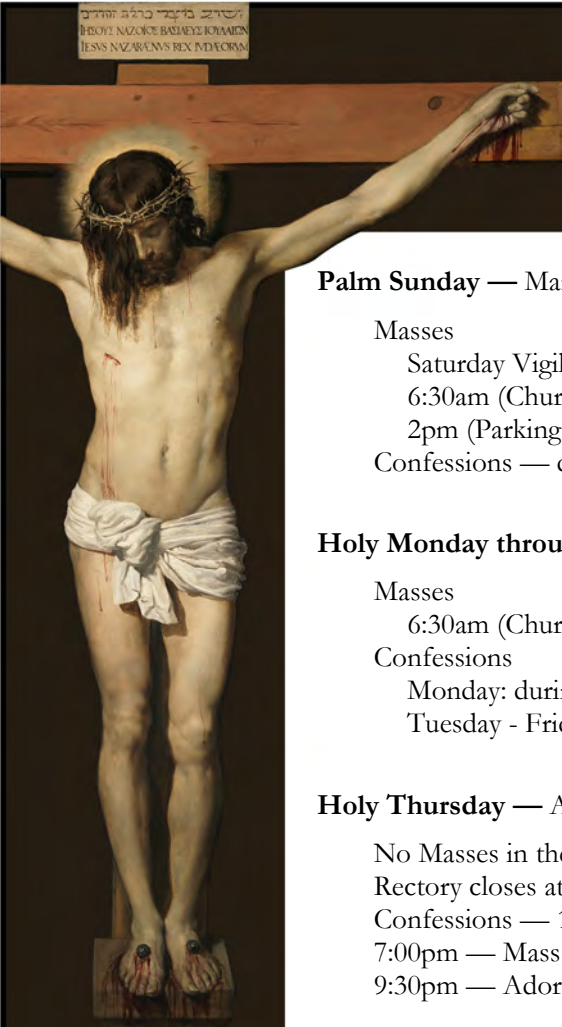

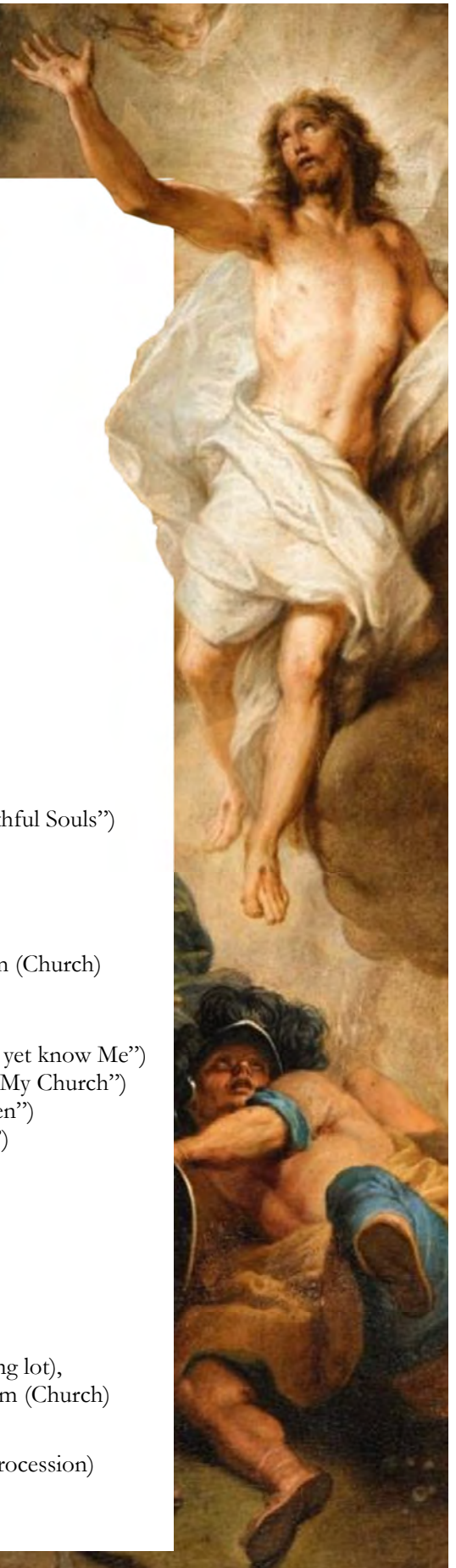

Mass in the Church: Please form a line before Mass begins. Please follow the instructions of the volunteer ushers who will be helping direct you to your places.

- You are encouraged to bring your own chairs if sitting outside.
- Please maintain a social distance between the households (6ft).
- Children must always remain under the close supervision of parents/family at all times.
- There is no reservation system for Mass.

Mass in the parking lot: The only entrance/exit will be from Our Lady's Way. There will be a security guard and volunteers who will direct you to your parking spots.

- Please stay in your vehicles at all times, unless you need to line up for confession or use the restroom. The restrooms that are designated for public use are only in the Family Learning Center.
- We will broadcast the Mass on an FM radio signal (92.9 FM) so that you can follow along from your vehicle.
- Due to county restrictions, Mass is limited to 100 cars only. Holy Communion can only be distributed to those in their vehicles in the parking lot participating in the Mass.
- Please turn on your emergency blinker lights at the appropriate to indicate that you wish to receive Communion, then turn them off afterward.

You are also welcome to visit the shrine and pray outdoors! For your safety and the safety of others, please try to remain at least 6 feet apart from others and cover all sneezes and coughs.

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SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

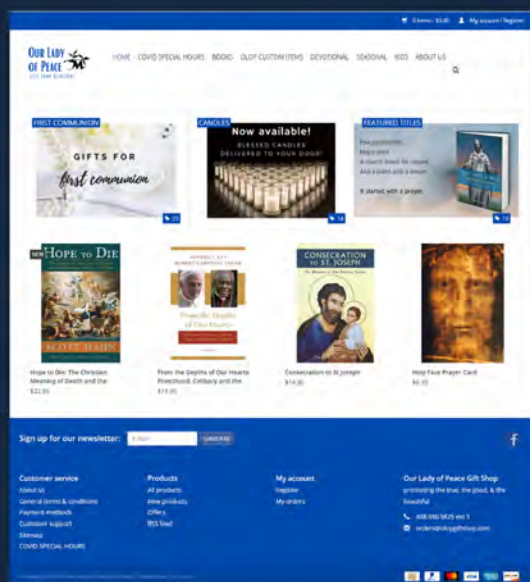
My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul.

FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older. From its earliest days, the Church has urged the baptized and the catechumens to observe the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer as a preparation for the celebration of Easter. Failure to observe individual days of penance is not considered serious, but failure to observe any penitential days at all or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

During Lent, the Church encourages attendance at daily Mass, self-imposed times of fasting, and generosity to local, national, and worldwide programs of sharing.

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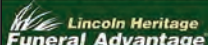
