FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Easter Sunday -- O Lord, Drive Away The Darkness

Dear Friends,

Many people have been reflecting upon this past year. We may rightly say that the days have seemed dark. Nevertheless, the sun continues to shine! And as we celebrate this Easter Solemnity, the Son continues to shine!

St. John Chrysostom, one of the greatest Early Church Fathers of the 5th Century, has some sound words for us today.

“O death, where is your sting? O Hades, where is your victory? Christ is risen and life is freed! Christ is risen and the tomb is emptied of the dead! For Christ, being risen from the dead, has become the Leader and Reviver of those who had fallen asleep. To Him be glory and power for ever and ever. Amen.”

These words are taken from an Easter Homily that he offered to the people of his time, but they echo to us throughout the ages.

“Let no one grieve over his poverty, for the universal kingdom has been revealed. Let no one weep over his sins, for pardon has shone from the grave. Let no one fear death, for the death of our Savior has set us free. He has destroyed it by enduring it. He has despoiled Hades by going down into its kingdom. He has angered it by allowing it to taste of his flesh.”

We should live as if we were resurrected: Seek the things that are above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth (Col 3:1-2); we should live in the freedom of the children of God who are not enslaved:

* neither under the dominion or glamor of the enemy and the lure of evil (Gal 4:3);

* nor under the dominion of selfish desires; (2 Cor 3:6)

* nor under the spirit of the world that looks to have the best, feel the best, be esteemed as the best. (1 Cor 2:12.)

Why? Because we must not submit again to the yoke of slavery...(otherwise) Christ would be of no benefit to us. We want to live in the spirit of that which Christ would approve. And so, we fix our eyes on the Lord, knowing that we don't have a permanent city here, as we are citizens of heaven. We are called to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world.

Let us not look at the trials of this world as if we were to remain in this world forever, but may we look to eternal life, that is, to heaven where the Son is seated at the right hand of the Father interceding for us. May we meditate upon this reality and be filled with hope. Indeed, this past year has seen some dark days, and there may still be dark days ahead, but find courage in the fact that Christ stands before God and is praying for me. “His prayer on the Cross is contemporary with all human beings, contemporary with me. He prays for me, he suffered and suffers for me, he identified himself with me, taking our body and the human soul. And he asks us to enter this identity of his, making ourselves one body, one spirit with him because from the summit of the Cross he brought not new laws, tablets of stone, but himself, his Body and his Blood, as the New Covenant. Thus he brings us kinship with him, he makes us one body with him, identifies us with him. He invites us to enter into this identification, to be united with him in our wish to be one body, one spirit with him. Let us pray the Lord that this identification may transform and renew us, because forgiveness is renewal and transformation.” (Benedict XVI, *General Audience*, 1 June 2011)

May ours be the prayer of St. Ephrem, “O Lord, drive away the darkness from our minds with the light of your wisdom, so that enlightened in this way we may serve you with renewed purity. The beginning of the sun's passage through the sky marks the beginning of the working-day for us mortals: we ask you, Lord, to prepare in our minds a place where the day that knows no end may give its light.”

Grant that we may have within us this light, the life of the resurrection, and that nothing may take away our delight in you. Mark us with the sign of that day that does not begin with the movement and the course of the sun, by keeping our minds fixed on you. Happy Easter!

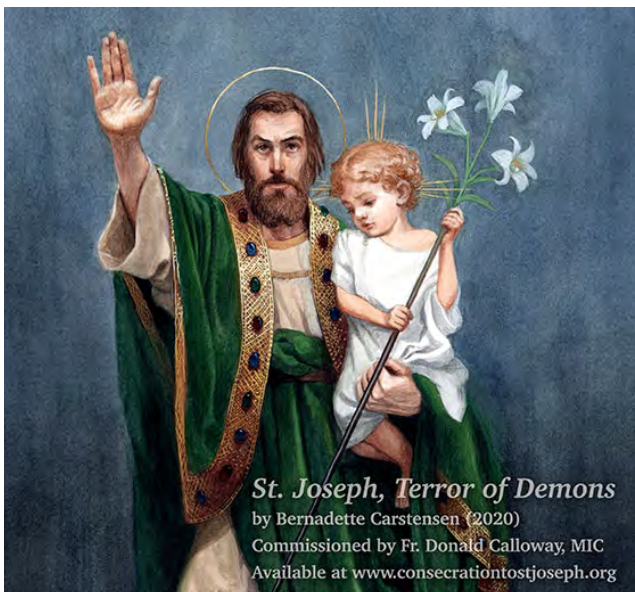

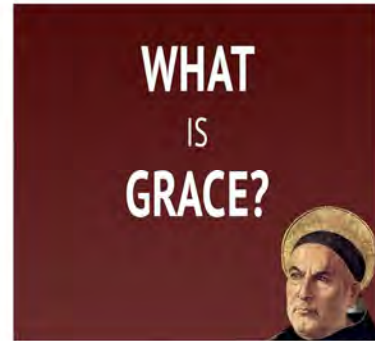

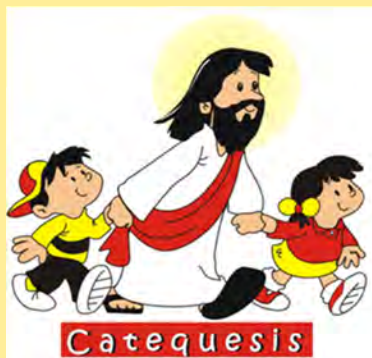

Mass in the Church: Please form a line before Mass begins. Please follow the instructions of the volunteer ushers who will be helping direct you to your places.

- You are encouraged to bring your own chairs if sitting outside.
- Please maintain a social distance between the households (6ft).
- Children must always remain under the close supervision of parents/family at all times.
- There is no reservation system for Mass.

Mass in the parking lot: The only entrance/exit will be from Our Lady's Way. There will be a security guard and volunteers who will direct you to your parking spots.

- Please stay in your vehicles at all times, unless you need to line up for confession or use the restroom. The restrooms that are designated for public use are only in the Family Learning Center.
- We will broadcast the Mass on an FM radio signal (92.9 FM) so that you can follow along from your vehicle.
- Due to county restrictions, Mass is limited to 100 cars only. Holy Communion can only be distributed to those in their vehicles in the parking lot participating in the Mass.
- Please turn on your emergency blinker lights at the appropriate to indicate that you wish to receive Communion, then turn them off afterward.

You are also welcome to visit the shrine and pray outdoors! For your safety and the safety of others, please try to remain at least 6 feet apart from others and cover all sneezes and coughs.

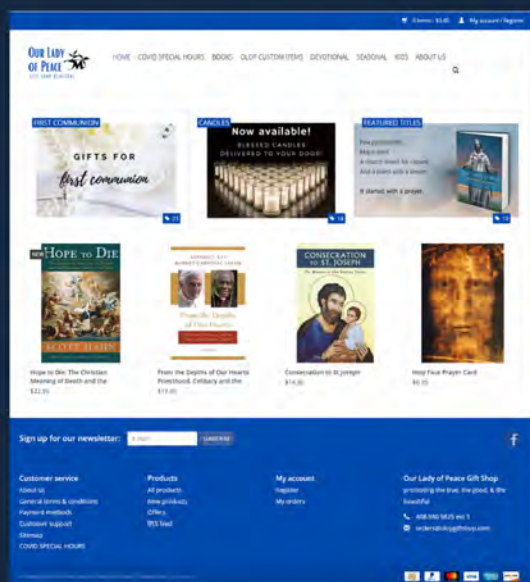
