FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Who is the Greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven?

Dear Friends,

People once asked Jesus, “Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?” He called a child over, placed it in their midst, and said, “Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.” (Mt 18:1-3)

This past week, we celebrated the memorials of three saints—St. Aloysius Gonzaga, St. John Fisher, and St. Thomas More—who help teach us this important lesson, from different angles.

One of the great ironies found between children and adults is that children cannot wait to be adults and adults would give anything to be children again. Now, if you ask any adult why they would love to be a child again, they would tell you it is because children are free—free from worries, cares and responsibilities. It is important to note, however, that the freedom that the child enjoys is not primarily because they are exempt from such things; rather, their freedom lies in the confidence and trust they have in their parents. “My mom or dad are taking care of me, so let me play!”

St. Aloysius Gonzaga, whose memorial we celebrate today, is a model of child-like purity. He was one who was young in earthly years—not yet reaching the age of 24 years; but so advanced in age of the spirit that he was proclaimed a saint by the universal church. It was Pope Pius the XI that made him the universal patron of the youth, as a model of purity. It was St. Mary Magdalene de Pazzi who, in prayer, asked “how did St. Aloysius rise to such heights and so quickly?” And our Lord answered: “He rose on the wings of great desires.” He had a great desire for the Lord, for holiness, to serve the kingdom of God. His heart was pure—it was single-minded. For, it is the pure of heart who will see God.

Similar childlikeness we find in St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher. Taking a look at St. Thomas

More in particular we see one who was similarly devoted to God; he completely trusted in Divine Providence. Jesus asks for childlike abandonment to the providence of our heavenly Father who takes care of his children's smallest needs. St. Thomas More expresses this trust, most poignantly in a letter to his daughter from a cell in the Tower of London where he had been imprisoned by King Henry VIII, “And, therefore, my own good daughter, do not let your mind be troubled over anything that shall happen to me in this world. Nothing can come but what God wills. And I am very sure that whatever that be, however bad it may seem, it shall indeed be the best.”

He was an individual who was clear-minded and decided. In a word, He was free. He manifested the freedom that is the mark of the children of God.

Now, what I find interesting in these examples is how they seem to lead to the same thing, freedom. A healthy and ordered youthfulness leads to maturity. And a healthy and mature adult leads to childlikeness. Both of these things, maturity and childlikeness, are like two sides to the same coin.

Unfortunately, our modern secular culture oftentimes has reversed these two roles. On the one hand, the culture forces children to “grow up” prematurely. Under the guise of freedom and respect, modern education is bombarding children with adult-age themes fueled by ideologies. Meanwhile, screens and secular popular culture can stifle experiences that are uniquely and particularly youthful—cultivating the imagination, playing outdoors, learning about one’s heritage.

On the other hand, we can find the prevalence of adults who are, to the neglect of their own vocation and responsibilities, are acting more like children. For example, men at the age of thirty-three are the largest

FEEDING FAITH BOOK OF THE MONTH

“Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give you light.” —Ephesians 5:14

The long-simmering crisis that grips our culture has exploded in recent years, leaving us divided and intransigent. PARISH REGISTRATION

ARE YOU A REGISTERED PARISHIONER?

If you attend Mass here regularly, we encourage you to register as a member of Our Lady of Peace Catholic Church.

Three main reasons why registering is important:

1. Letters of Recommendation

Sometimes there are occasions where letters of recommendations are needed from your parish pastor (ie Catholic school enrollment, scholarships, godparent eligibility, etc.). If you're not registered, we cannot provide this letter to you or your family.

2. Make Sacrament prep easier when the time comes.

Infant baptisms, religious education registration, being a godparent/sponsor for baptisms or confirmations, and especially getting married (whether you are getting married at this parish, another parish, or having an international Catholic wedding). If you're not a registered parishioner, this will greatly delay the process.

3. If we as a parish do not know who is out there, how can we serve the needs of all?

This includes single people or young families who may not see the need to register.

Anyone, regardless of where they live is welcome to register at OLOP (even though the Diocese is divided into parish geographical areas).

Please note: there is a three (3) month waiting period from the date of registration before being considered a full-fledged registered parishioner. Any requests for pastor signatures on any forms, letters, or wedding preparation paperwork will not be processed within the 3 months.
