FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Don't Forget About the Year of St. Joseph – ITE AD JOSEPH! (Go to Joseph!)

Dear Friends,

I am writing this on Wednesday, July 7th, 2021. For this to make at least a little bit of sense to you, I ask you to read the first reading from this day (Wednesday of the 14th Week in Ordinary Time). The passage is Genesis 41:55-57; 42:5-7a, 17-24a.

Why do I want to refer you to this? Because I forgot to mention something in the homily that I wanted to say, that I felt prompted to say, but in the moment could not remember it. This happens to you when you have a poor memory and experience a lot of nerves when speaking in front of people!! And usually, it comes back to you like a lightning bolt just moments later.

First, a brief introduction to the text. The first reading gives the account of the patriarch Joseph, the son of Jacob. In the Old Testament we have people and things that foreshadow or prefigure individuals or lessons in the New Testament. Here, following the authority of the Fathers of the Church, this ancient patriarch most clearly prefigured St. Joseph, the foster father of Jesus and universal patron of the Church.

We see how Pharaoh, having recognized the wisdom of Joseph exclaims: “There is no one as discerning and wise as you are. You shall be in charge of my household, and all my people will obey your command. Only in respect to the throne will I outrank you. Then Pharaoh said to Joseph, “Look, I put you in charge of the whole land of Egypt.” And so, “When hunger came to be felt throughout the land of Egypt and the people cried to Pharaoh for bread, Pharaoh directed all the Egyptians to GO TO JOSEPH and do whatever he told them.” Here then is an express figure of the second Joseph, when he was constituted by God “Head of the Holy Family” and Patron of the Catholic Church.

In Egypt, during the times of Joseph the patriarch, there was a famine across the land. God provided for them through Joseph.

Here's what I wanted to add. There is a similar famine that is striking our land; however, as individuals we may not necessarily see it or feel it—immediately. The famine is of the moral order. When the body is famished and lacks nourishment it grows weak and emaciated. Now, what about when there is a moral famine that strikes the land? We become weak and emaciated not in terms of body weight, but in the strength of our wills—the seat of action and decision. Our wills become weak. As we continue to

learn how to dominate the nature outside of us, we lose all control of the nature inside of us. The moral malnourishment that exists goes unperceived because of the invigorating experience of dominating everything outside of us. This is indeed a pitiable state, one worth mourning over. I think this is why Joseph the patriarch wept. He was too virtuous and righteous to be weeping over himself and the ill-treatment of his brothers. He was mourning for their spiritual depravity rather than their material.

In modern times, no one was as identified with the destitute than Mother Teresa, those who were stricken by material famine. In 1982, when she spoke to the graduates of Harvard University, one of the most privileged institutions of education in the most prosperous nation in the world, one would expect her to speak about poverty. She did just that. She said that the poorest of the poor were not in the slums of India, but in America. She called abortion one of the greatest poverties. She said, “A nation, people, family that allows that, that accepts that, they are the poorest of the poor.”

Just as through Joseph, the son of Israel, God provided food for the starving people of Egypt and his family, so through Joseph, the husband of Mary, did God the Father provide for the needs of His only begotten Son – who provides for all of humanity. So, we are reminded today through the old testament reading – God to Joseph. In a time of famine, turn to Joseph. The patriarch was the caretaker of the King's bread, which provided substance for the people; Joseph is the custodian of the Bread that came down from heaven, a bread that shall never leave us hungry.

These things are providentially relevant to us: famine, Joseph, Bread that gives life and satisfies our hunger. The social and moral upheavals that we are experiencing in so many different orders are the hunger pains of a world that is starving.

If God the Father was pleased to provide for His Son, Jesus, through St. Joseph, then we can be confident that if we turn to St. Joseph as God's faithful steward we will not lack for anything. God's providence has ushered forth the “Year of St. Joseph”. In times of distress, go to Joseph. As the spouse of Mary and the father of Jesus St. Joseph placed himself, according to St. John Chrysostom, “at the service of the entire plan of salvation.” Let us remember this!





Fatima Pilgrimage Nights



FEEDING FAITH BOOK OF THE MONTH

“Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give you light.” —Ephesians 5:14

The long-simmering crisis that grips our culture has exploded in recent years, leaving us divided and intransigent. Discourse seems futile when we are no longer a people with shared principles or even a shared understanding of reality. What seems obvious to one person is patently absurd to the next.

This collapse of meaning is not accidental. It has been plotted and documented for decades, and now presents in its current form as Woke ideology.

Awake, Not Woke unmasks this ideology by examining its history, major players, premises, and tactics, showing us that “Wokeness” at its core is an ideology of rupture. Indeed, it is an ideology with fundamentalist and even cult-like characteristics that is on a collision course with Christianity.

With a wit and clarity that both exposes the absurd and mourns the brokenness of our culture,

Noelle Mering provides answers to such questions as:

- Why does tolerance seem to only go in one direction?
- How does the ideology create enemies, eroding friendship across the sexes and races?
- Why is violence the natural end of Woke ideology?
- Why are the Woke considered blameless?
- Why have politics become all-absorbing?
- Why is the corruption of children a logical outgrowth of Woke principles?
- How is the movement fundamentally a rejection of the Logos?



This is a spiritual battle, and it is not accidental. The architects of revolution have long known that the transformation of the West had to come by way of destabilizing the social, familial, and religious pieties of a citizenry.

But there is a road to restoration, and it begins with identifying and understanding the operating principles of the Woke movement. While the revolution is a counterfeit religion resulting in alienation and division, the One True Faith brings restoration. It is this restoration -- of the person, the family, and the Faith -- for which we all hunger and is the most fitting avenue toward a more harmonious and whole society

SUMMER ORATORY ANNOUNCEMENT

MASS INTENTION REQUESTS

The calendar is currently open for Mass intention requests for the month of July 2021! The book will be open for August starting on Tuesday, July 13th.

Please follow the temporary process listed below.

At this time we have instituted a temporary process to accept and process Mass Intention requests via email. The normal Mass Intention guidelines listed below apply, including the 25 character limit.

Mass Intention request requirements:

- Donation of \$10 per Mass
- Only 2 requests, per day, per requestor
- Each Mass may only have 2 names with a limit of 25 characters (including spaces), and only one intention option chosen (Birthday, Death Anniversary, Health, Special Intentions, Thanksgiving, or Wedding Anniversary).
- Please remember to note if the request is for someone living or deceased.
- No changes can be made once the requests have been placed into the calendar.
- No holds or reservations will be accepted. No exceptions can be made.


In order to request a Mass Intention during this shelter-in time, please carefully follow the steps below:

1. First, please send an email to mass@olop-shrine.org with:
 - your full name,
 - phone number,
 - Mass Intention request texts (limit 25 characters, specify living or deceased),
 - and preferred dates/times (at least 1 week ahead).
2. Once the email is received, our staff will look through the calendar for availability. Until the intention request is finalized by a confirmation reply email from our staff, the intention is not considered entered in the calendar. **Due to the volume of requests, it is best to request a Mass intention at least one week prior to the desired date.**
3. If there is a time conflict with the requested date/time, our staff member will call you to arrange. You will also receive a call if there are any changes needed to the request. Lack of phone number may cause delays.
4. The confirmation email will give a link indicating how to submit your Mass Intention request donation online.


