FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

What's Your Summer Plan?

Dear Friends,

Summer officially started on June 20, which is the summer solstice or when the Sun reaches its highest point in the sky. This year, summer will end on September 22. So, if you are counting, from end to finish, there are 95 days of summer.

What's the plan?

I know that for many of you, not much will change in terms of work-life responsibilities and the daily/weekly schedule. I presume that it has not always been this way. For the large majority of us, summer was a time in which we took a break from schoolwork, played outside, and did things with friends and family. Why not keep these pastimes alive in an intentional way? God has given us different seasons in nature and Holy Mother Church observes liturgical seasons. There is a certain reverence involved in working ourselves within the natural cadences of the life and seasons around us. It enriches our lives. Here is a proposal.

First, **make a summer reading plan**, just like when you are a kid. I recommend buying a book, something you can feel, smell, and does not require charging. If you are a little weary about the prospect of selecting a title, I would like to offer some ideas, in no particular order.

1. Read about the life of a saint or the direct writing of a saint. You are usually safe in getting to know this "cloud of witnesses" that have gone before us. Make a friend this summer; get to know one.
2. Take it from the Fathers. There is a wonderful array of writings by the Church Fathers, perhaps the summer could be a good moment to pick one (St. Augustine, St. Jerome, St. Basil the Great, St. John Chrysostom, St. Athanasius, St. Justin, St. Gregory the Great, St. Leo the Great, St. Gregory Nazianzus, and more).
3. How about a literature classic? Here is the link to a great article written by the Bishop of Lincoln: [Sursum Corda: 10 Suggestions for Rekindling the Literary Imagination \(lincolndiocese.org\)](https://www.dsj.org/wp-content/uploads/Pilgrimage-Sites-EN.png).
4. Lastly, here's a wild card option: come on down to the OLOP Gift Shop and simply pick a book that catches your eye. We have lots of great titles and buying local these days is a great help!

Second, **spend time with family and friends**. This can take on a special significance this summer, given the many months of social distancing. Summer is a great time for

outdoor BBQ or getting together at the park. What about simply sitting in the backyard chatting under the night sky? It could be a good time to get together with relatives that you have not seen for a while or if distancing is still a concern, perhaps you can make some phone calls to loved ones. There is something nice about calling just to chat or even to reminisce. It's looking to create that "campfire moment." If you have ever been around a campfire, stories seem to flow naturally. Spending time with family and friends really has as its goal the enriching experience of conversation. These gatherings provide a place for stories to be told and listening to be cultivated. Consider doing this your Heavenly Mother, Mary, sitting out on the Shrine Lawn. Consider doing this with Jesus Christ, God who is with us, in Eucharistic Adoration. Start a consistent and regular conversation with God through a Holy Hour. I highly recommend it!

Third, **plan an outdoor excursion**. We are in California people! When it comes to outdoor beauty and variety, there are few states that can compare. You can travel north to the wine country. How about travelling to the East? You will run into Yosemite National Park. If you are from California and you have not yet visited it, don't waste anymore time! It's too great to describe. You could keep going to the South East and you have the Sierra Nevadas, Kings Canyon, Inyo National Park, etc., etc., etc. How about Pinnacles National Park or go out into the Redwood forests. If you are adventurous, you might even make it a weekend and sleep in a tent! In case you have forgotten, you could also travel just a short ways to the West and you will find beaches and the Pacific Ocean. Given all of these options, perhaps one outdoor excursion might not be enough. Therefore, I want to challenge you to take your outdoor excursion to the next level. Remember, we are in the year of St. Joseph. So, you might consider doing a pilgrimage to the different churches that have been designated as the Jubilee Year pilgrimage sites: <https://www.dsj.org/wp-content/uploads/Pilgrimage-Sites-EN.png> (FYI, plenary indulgences are available under the usual conditions).

Okay, I hope you have a nice summer and be sure to join us each 13th of the Month until October (once Autumn has already begun) at our Fatima Masses. Here at Our Lady of Peace, these masses are a beautiful tradition that really mark our Summer Life. I hope you will join us!



FEEDING FAITH BOOK OF THE MONTH

“Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give you light.” —Ephesians 5:14

The long-simmering crisis that grips our culture has exploded in recent years, leaving us divided and intransigent. Discourse seems futile when we are no longer a people with shared principles or even a shared understanding of reality. What seems obvious to one person is patently absurd to the next.


This collapse of meaning is not accidental. It has been plotted and documented for decades, and now presents in its current form as Woke ideology.

Awake, Not Woke unmasks this ideology by examining its history, major players, premises, and tactics, showing us that “Wokeness” at its core is an ideology of rupture. Indeed, it is an ideology with fundamentalist and even cult-like characteristics that is on a collision course with Christianity.

With a wit and clarity that both exposes the absurd and mourns the brokenness of our culture,

Noelle Mering provides answers to such questions as:

- Why does tolerance seem to only go in one direction?
- How does the ideology create enemies, eroding friendship across the sexes and races?
- Why is violence the natural end of Woke ideology?
- Why are the Woke considered blameless?
- Why have politics become all-absorbing?
- Why is the corruption of children a logical outgrowth of Woke principles?
- How is the movement fundamentally a rejection of the Logos?



This is a spiritual battle, and it is not accidental. The architects of revolution have long known that the transformation of the West had to come by way of destabilizing the social, familial, and religious pieties of a citizenry.

But there is a road to restoration, and it begins with identifying and understanding the operating principles of the Woke movement. While the revolution is a counterfeit religion resulting in alienation and division, the One True Faith brings restoration. It is this restoration -- of the person, the family, and the Faith -- for which we all hunger and is the most fitting avenue toward a more harmonious and whole society


