

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

God's Ways Are Not Our Ways—Thanks Be to God!

Dear Friends,

This past Monday, September 20, we celebrated the memorial of St. Andrew Kim Tae-gon and his companion martyrs. At the age of 15, he was identified by a smuggled French missionary priest as someone with a priestly vocation, and he was sent to walk by foot over 1300 miles to study in a seminary in Macão. Biographers relate that, even as a child, Andrew's intelligence was striking to the missionaries. He had a great facility for learning and was obviously an individual of great fortitude and sacrifice. In short, he was very intelligent and had a strong will.

In 1845, He was ordained a priest in Shanghai by Jean Joseph Ferréol and he became the first native-born Korean priest. Then in October of that very same year, after having secretly worked among the faithful in his home town and surrounding region, Bishop Ferréol called him to Seoul in order to introduce French Missionaries from China into Korea. On the sailing voyage he was arrested, beaten, tortured, and put into prison in Seoul. He was sentenced to death and was beheaded on September 16, 1846.

So, to go back through this, here we have a young man who has dedicated himself to God. He has all of the natural and supernatural qualities that we could hope for and his life as a priest had just begun. Shouldn't God want to honor that? Shouldn't a God who is a loving father want this young priest, this young son, put these to good use? Why on earth would a God take him at that springtime of his life? What a waste, no?

I would like to use his own words taken from letters he wrote (from prison) to help us formulate a response to that view of martyrdom.

Firstly, while he was in prison awaiting execution, he wrote a letter to his fellow Korean Catholics to strengthen them in the faith. He wrote, "In this world of perils and hardship if we did not recognize the Lord as our Creator, there would be no benefit either in being born or in our continued existence. We have come into the world by God's grace; by that same grace we have received baptism, entrance into the Church, and the honor of being called Christians. Yet what good will this do us if we are Christians in name alone and not in fact? We would have come into the world for nothing, we would have entered the Church for nothing, and we would have betrayed even God and his grace. It would be better never to have been born than to receive the grace of God and then to sin against him." (*From the final exhortation of Andrew Kim Taegon, priest and martyr*)

Secondly, in another letter, recounting his capture, he relates, "When we reached the shore, the officers stripped me of my clothes, bound and beat me again with every sort of insult and sarcasm, and brought me to the court, where a great many persons were assembled. The mandarin said to me: "Are you a Christian?"

"Yes, I am," I answered.

"Why do you practice this religion contrary to the king's orders? Give it up."

"I practice my religion because it is true; it teaches me to know God, and brings me to eternal happiness: I know of no such thing as apostasy."

The torture was then applied to me, and the judge said, "If you do not apostatize you shall die under the blows."

"As you please, but I will never abandon my God." (*Letter to Bishop Jean Joseph Ferréol from prison, 26th August, 1846*)

Thirdly, again taken from the letter to his fellow Christians, he specifically called them to bear that fruit of fidelity with courage, knowing that suffering waters the seed of their faith and makes it grow by testing it. He writes, "when he was in the world, the Lord Jesus bore countless sorrows and by his own passion and death founded his Church; now he gives it increase through the sufferings of his faithful. No matter how fiercely the powers of this world oppress and oppose the Church, they will never bring it down. Ever since his ascension and from the time of the apostles to the present, the Lord Jesus has made his Church grow even in the midst of tribulations." (*From the final exhortation of Andrew Kim Taegon, priest and martyr*)

Okay, so to summarize this, let us remember God's ways are not our ways. We look at things, so often, from a human perspective. It is almost as if we are convinced that we can tell God how to do things. The blood of the martyrs and persecuted Christians, however, bear testimony to the ways of God. They teach us about the fruitfulness of God's plan and that—even though He may seem oblivious to our sufferings—as St. Andrew Kim reminded his companions, "God numbers the very hairs of our head and in his all-embracing providence he has care over us all. Persecution, therefore, can only be regarded as the command of the Lord or as a prize he gives or as a punishment he permits. Hold fast, then, to the will of God





ETHICS POINT

To enable the fulfillment of its mission the Diocese of San Jose is committed to transparent dealings with all of its faithful and members of the public.

Accountability is a very important element of this transparency. We attempt to involve a large and diversified number of people in consultative bodies at every level of the Church structure, through finance and parish councils and many other consultative groups.

Our goal is to protect not just our children and vulnerable adults, but all who interface with the Diocese through its parishes, schools and various departments, as well as the assets, financial and physical, entrusted to our care. We want to hear from you about any concerns that you have regarding the mis-management of parish and school property, including cash and all other assets and any apparent disregard of policies pertaining to the property management of these assets. We have selected EthicsPoint to provide us with an anonymous and confidential method to hear your suggestions, concerns or the report of misconduct. The information you provide will be sent to us by EthicsPoint on a totally confidential and anonymous basis.

EthicsPoint will accept reports of misconduct through its website at the links on their page, dsj.ethicspoint.com, or the hotline telephone number 1-888-325-7863. They will provide a complete report to the Diocese of San Jose. We will then continue the investigation and determine how best to resolve the issues. You will receive feedback on the progress of the investigation.

The calendar is currently open for Mass intention requests for months of September and October! The book will be open for November starting on Tuesday, October 12th. **Please follow the temporary process listed below.** The normal Mass Intention guidelines listed below apply, including the 25 character limit.

Mass Intention request requirements:

- Donation of \$10 per Mass
- Only 2 requests, per day, per requestor
- Each Mass may only have 2 names with a limit of 25 characters (including spaces), and only one intention option chosen (Birthday, Death Anniversary, Health, Special Intentions, Thanksgiving, or Wedding Anniversary). For those deceased, please only select either “Special Intentions” or “Death Anniversary”
- No changes can be made once the requests have been placed into the calendar.
- No holds or reservations will be accepted. No exceptions can be made.

In order to request a Mass Intention during this time, please carefully follow the steps below:

1. First, please send an email to mass@olop-shrine.org with:
 - your full name and phone number,
 - Mass Intention request texts (limit 25 characters, specify living or deceased),
 - and preferred dates/times (send the email at least 1-1.5 weeks ahead of the date you'd like)
2. Once the email is received, our staff will look through the calendar for availability. Until the intention request is finalized by a confirmation email from our staff, the intention is not considered entered in the calendar. **Due to the volume of requests, please send your email at least 1 week prior to the desired date.**
3. If there is a time conflict with the requested date/time, our staff member will call you to arrange. You will also receive a call if there are any changes needed to the request. Lack of phone number may cause delays.
4. The confirmation email will give a link indicating how to submit your Mass Intention request donation online.
