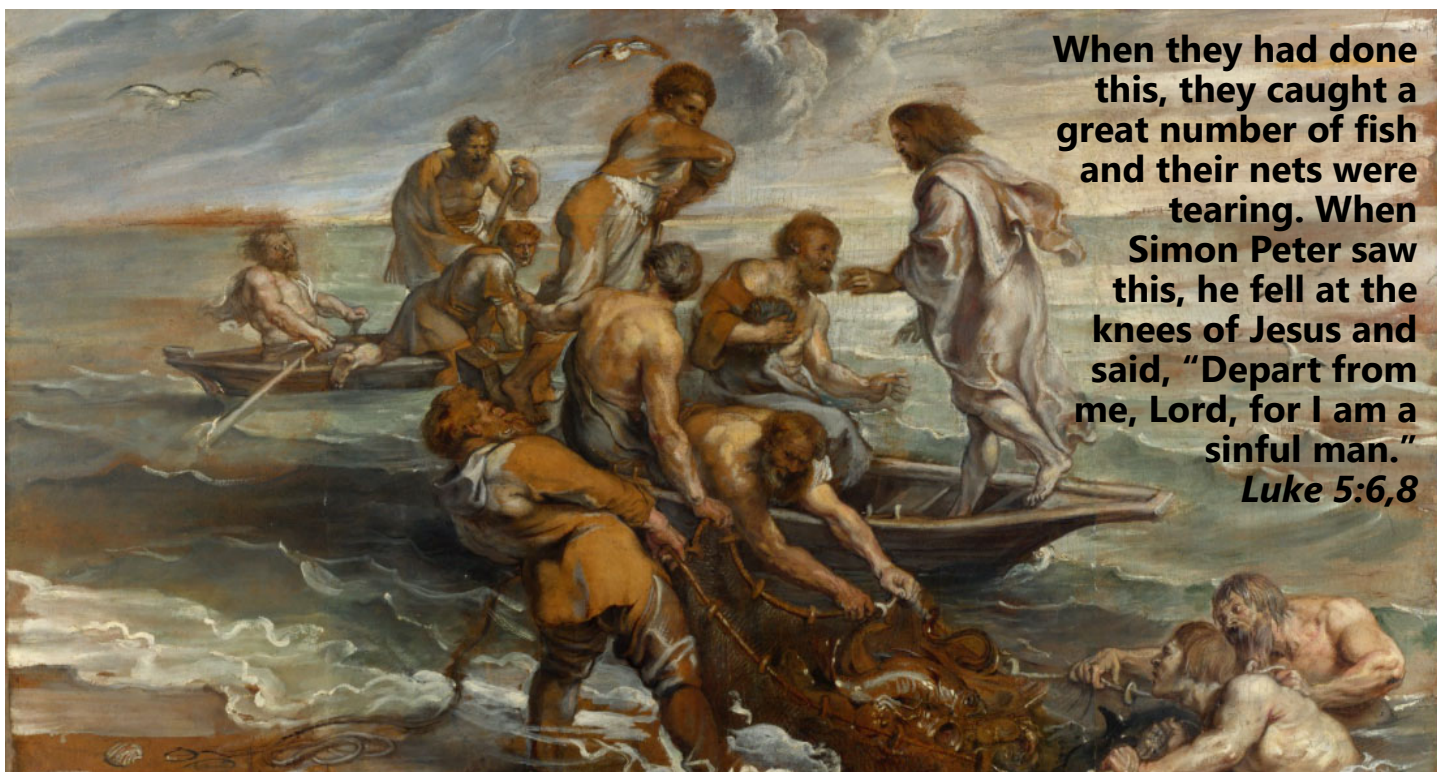

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give." – Mt. 10:8

Dear Friends,

This weekend is the Annual Diocesan Appeal (ADA) Kick-Off Weekend. I hope that you will give something. If you are reading this and you haven't ever given to the ADA I would encourage you to give at least something.

I encourage all of you, new and long-time parishioner, married and single, to consider your stewardship and recognize that we have a need to give. It is a part of all of our lives, no matter what situation we are living in. It calls us to trust in the ways of the Lord, which is what we asked for in the Psalm – to be guided in the truth – for He is our God and our Savior. Therefore, it is a grateful act of trust and an act of worship to the God who loved us first. (Cf., 1 Jn 4:19)

Stewardship is woven into the fabric of many New Testament accounts. There are many parables that exhort us to acknowledge and cherish what we have received from God and return it to Him with increase. Thereby we must first note that he said come follow me – for a purpose – “and I will make you fishers of men.” (Mk 1:17) This marks the very beginning of their discipleship. Let us fast forward to the very end of Mark's Gospel. He commissions them: “Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned.” (Mk 16:15-16)

As stewards, we must acknowledge and cherish what we have received from God and return it to him. We must strive to live the mandate of the Lord spoken to Peter and the apostles ‘go, make disciples of all nations, baptizing...’. Stewardship lived as a way of life bears much fruit as disciples of Jesus Christ. A disciple learns from the teacher; he takes notes from the teacher's lessons. A steward acts like the teacher; a steward lives the lessons.

We are called to stewardship because we imitate Jesus Christ who was the steward par excellence. He gives us everything. Jesus was the divine omnipotent, omniscient God. He had all power, all knowledge, he is rich in every possible way. He had no need for us. He who did not have to die, offered his last to us so that we could live. Jesus poured everything out, in service of His Father, as an example to us so that we would not be afraid to pour ourselves out for Him and for our neighbor. Because He gave Himself away, we inherited eternal life, because He died, He opened a bridge to heaven for you! Wouldn't you want to or feel it your responsibility to usher as many

people across that bridge as possible? Our stewardship is imitating Jesus in His self-offering. It is a faith-based response. We are not stewards to get God to give us our way, but because we are grateful. Our giving therefore, must not be seen as an exchange of resources such that, “so long as I give a certain amount or I put in this much time, I expect a return.” Our faith is a gift that we have received and it is ours to go and share.

The whole point of Our Lady of Peace Church in the Diocese of San Jose is to save souls. By offering the man Jesus Christ, who revealed the Heavenly Father's love and fills us with the Holy Spirit so that we may be one body in Christ. Everything in this local Church of the Diocese of San Jose happens for the sake of Jesus Christ. And so we have a mission, to go therefore and make disciples of nations, I have made of you fishers of men. Every act of stewardship that takes place for this parish family, is an act of proclaiming the Gospel. Prayers, volunteering your time – in any capacity, financial contributions. There is a spirituality behind this, it is time, talent and treasure. Not time, talent or treasure. One doesn't replace the other.

It is not uncommon for people to mistakenly equate stewardship with raising money. Such a narrow attitude is a great disservice to the mandate of Jesus. Rather, Stewardship is a call, an invitation, an exhortation for each person of faith to look within themselves and open wide new ways to live their vocation, to give of their talents, their gifts, their time, and yes, their treasure.

For those who do so with the framework of prayer and with the desire to do God's Will, it brings untold blessings for both those serving and those served (cf Jn 15). The blessings (rewards) are not the reason for living stewardship but they cannot be kept out.

Herein lies the paradox of stewardship, it is the secret of Joy. In my free gift of self, losing for the sake of the Gospel, I gain. In my free gift of self, when I truly lay down my talents and my gifts for other people, I in fact find myself. This is why Jesus says, “whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it.” (Mk 8:35) And the normal act of laying down our life for our brothers and sisters is Stewardship. We belong to a community that appreciates and depends upon our participation.

MASS INTENTION REQUESTS

The calendar is currently open for Mass intention requests for months of February 2022 and will open for March on February 8th. **Please follow the temporary process listed below.** The normal Mass Intention guidelines listed below apply, including the 25 character limit.

Mass Intention request requirements:

- Donation of \$10 per Mass
- Only 2 requests can be made, per day, per requestor
- Each Mass may only have 2 names with a limit of 25 characters (including spaces), and only one intention option chosen (Birthday, Death Anniversary, Health, Special Intentions, Thanksgiving, or Wedding Anniversary). For those deceased, please only select either "Special Intentions" or "Death Anniversary"
- No changes can be made once the requests have been placed into the calendar.
- No holds or reservations will be accepted. No exceptions can be made.

In order to request a Mass Intention, please carefully follow the steps on our website page: bit.ly/olop-mass-requests

MASS GUIDELINES

- Per county and diocesan protocols, **masks are required indoors** regardless of vaccination status.
- The social distance between households during worship and non-worship gatherings is currently reduced from 6 feet to 3 feet (so all pews will be open).
- Visitors to the Rectory Office will be asked to continue masking, keeping adequate distance, and keeping hands clean/sanitized.
- Meetings, events, and receptions will resume at a later date as health guidelines evolve.
