FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Lent – A Time to Reach Out To Heaven

Dear Friends,

In the year 1082 at the Sorbonne, in the chapel of the university, the funeral of a great university professor, was being celebrated. A Doctor, who had always been considered very learned and at the same time very pious, died. His death seemed a very happy one, as it followed soon after his having received the holy Sacraments. But when the corpse was brought to the church, for the funeral ceremonies and the usual prayers, behold! the dead man arose during the Office of the Dead, to the great horror of all present, and cried, with a terrible voice: "The Justice of God has accused me!" On the second day, when the clergy had reached the same lesson in the Office, the body again moved, and cried in the same fearful tones: "The Justice of God has rejected me!" On the third day, the same happened: the dead sitting up, cried with a still more awful voice: "The Justice of God has condemned me!" (*taken from Fr. Francis Xavier Weninger, 1876*) After the ceremonies were suspended, the corpse was buried outside the sacred place. Among those present was one of the most celebrated doctors of the time, named Bruno. Frightened by what had happened, he decided to retire there and live a life more conscious of judgment and eternity. He founded a very austere order: he was St. Bruno, founder of the Carthusians.

At the beginning of Lent, on Ash Wednesday, we are reminded of the reality of death: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Who likes to talk about death? But it turns out that not talking about death, and especially not thinking about death, is a foolish attitude: by not thinking about it, can we keep it away from us? It will come, without fail, at the moment that God our Lord has fixed for us from all eternity: whether we think about it or not.

There are two prevailing (and opposing) conceptions of death, just as there are of life: the materialistic worldly view, which denies the existence of an afterlife; and the Christian spiritual view, which proclaims the reality of life after death. One says, "live it up now, because this is all there is." The other says, "For to me life is Christ, and death is gain.... I long to depart this life and be with Christ, for that is far better. Yet that I remain in the flesh is more necessary for your benefit." (Phil 1:20-23) All of us will die; but do we think about death as pagans or as Christians? What are the characteristics of death, those characteristics that our personal death will have? There are three: it is certain in its coming, it is uncertain in its circumstances and it is unique in life.

1) *Certain in its coming.* Men doubt many things, but they do not doubt that they will die. They may not think about it and may fill their heads with millions of other thoughts, but the moment they think about death, they will have the certainty that they are going to die.

2) *It is uncertain and insecure in its circumstances:*

-Some die of what they call today natural death, that is, of old age.

-Others die of premature death, in the prime of youth, in the springtime of life. How many young people die every day!

-Others die a violent death: in accidents; just at the moment when perhaps they were in the most perfect health.

-Others die a sudden death: not from an accident but from an illness, a cerebral hemorrhage, a heart-attack, and this instantaneously and unexpectedly.

3) *One dies only once.* Only once and in that one time our eternal destinies will be irrevocably decided. We stake everything on a single card. Whoever gets it right that time will be right forever; whoever gets it wrong that time will be wrong forever.

The death of the body, which neither pleases God nor is willed by God, speaks to us of another more tremendous reality: the death of the soul, sin.

It is deprivation of God, therefore, it is ALL THE CONTRARY OF GOD:

God is light (Jn 1:19), deprived of Him is darkness.

God is joy (Is 35:10), deprived of Him is weeping and pain.

God is happiness (Ps 83:5), deprived of Him is anguish.

God is love (Jn 4:16), deprived of Him is hatred.

God is peace (Is 9:6), deprived of Him is war, hostility and discord.

God is beauty (Song 1:15), deprived of Him is ugliness and deformity.

God is father and refuge (Lk 15), deprived of Him is abandonment.

God is life, deprived of Him is death

LENT - FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Lenten Regulations on Fasting and Abstinence

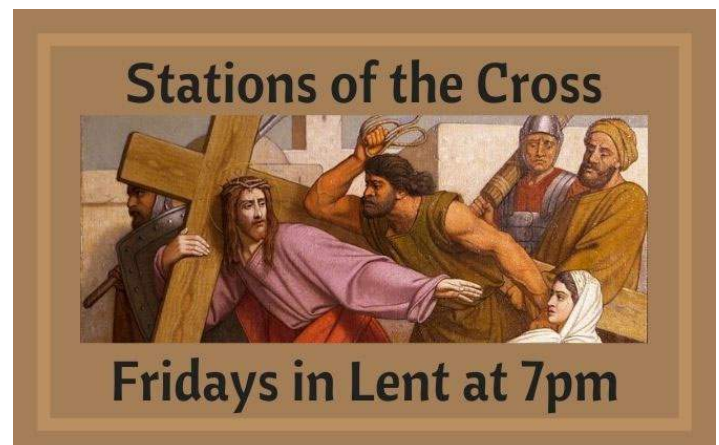
Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older.

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

The special Pascal fast and abstinence are observed on Good Friday, and where possible, Holy Saturday. On these days, Christians prepare themselves by these disciplines in anticipation of the renewal of their baptismal commitment on Easter.

From its earliest days, the Church has urged the baptized and the catechumens to observe the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer as a preparation for the celebration of Easter. Failure to observe individual days of penance is not considered serious, but failure to observe any penitential days at all or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

During Lent, the Church encourages attendance at daily Mass, self-imposed times of fasting, and generosity to local, national, and worldwide programs of sharing.



The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation. The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station. At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete.

The Stations of the Cross are commonly found in churches as a series of 14 small icons or images. They can also appear in church yards arranged along paths. The stations are most commonly prayed during Lent on Wednesdays and Fridays, and especially on Good Friday, the day of the year upon which the events actually occurred.

Join the parish every Friday in Lent with the Stations of the Cross starting at 7pm.

Note: We have now transitioned onto an online platform to accept Mass requests. From this time onward, we will no longer be accepting requests via email.

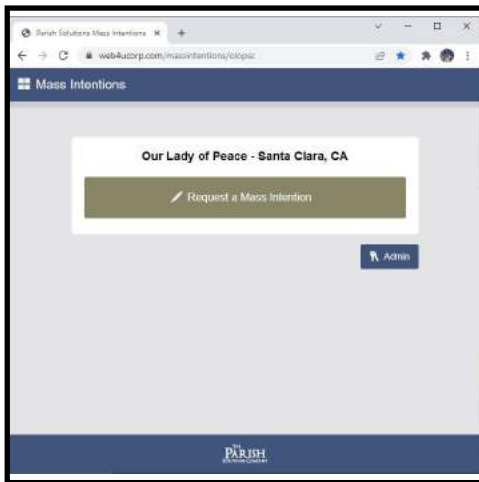
The calendar is currently open for Mass intention requests for the months of March and April only!

Please follow the requirements listed below.

Mass Intention request requirements:

- Donation of \$10 per Mass
- Limit of 1 individual Mass per week. Do not request more than 1 non-collective Mass in the same week.
- Each Mass may only have 2 names with a limit of 30 characters (including spaces) per Mass request.
- Please remember to note if the request is for someone living or deceased.
- Only one intention option chosen (see below table for available options).
- No changes can be made once the requests have been placed into the calendar.
- No holds or reservations will be accepted. No exceptions can be made.

How To Request Mass using the Online Portal



In order to request a Mass Intention, please carefully follow the steps written on the page and also in further detail on our website page: bit.ly/olop-mass-requests

1. Go to our online portal
2. Choose a Mass time to request. If you don't see a time listed, it is not available and a pending/approved request was already made.
3. Enter in all the details for the Mass request. Each individual Mass intention may only have up to 2 names with a limit of 30 characters (including spaces) per Mass request.

4. Choose only one intention option to add onto the name(s) (see table below)
5. Submit your Mass request. This removes the time slot from the calendar, which prevents duplicate requests.
6. Clicking "Donate Now" will take you to our online Donation portal. You can also donate in person at the office or by mail. If you are donating by mail, please include your name, intention information, and phone number.
7. Once the request is received, our staff will double check for availability. Until the intention request is finalized by a confirmation reply email, the intention is not considered entered in the calendar. You will receive a call if there are any time conflicts or changes needed.

- +Anne Sample, Birthday (invalid option for deceased person)
- Esther Sample, Health & Thanksgiving (more than one option chosen)

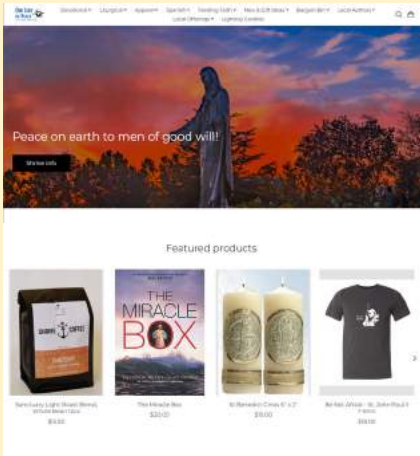
