

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### *Do Not Let Your Hearts Be Troubled – Pray The Rosary!*

Dear Friends,

With so much going on in the world around us, one cannot help but be a little anxious about things. For two years now, we have been facing many different trials and tribulations on a global scale.

Here are seven words worth remembering, “Do not let your hearts be troubled.” (John 14:1) Here’s seven more, “Woman, behold, your son. [...] Behold, your mother.”

**DO NOT LET YOUR HEARTS BE TROUBLED.**

Disorder is troubling; it is disturbing. Order is peaceful; it is quieting.

If we follow the teaching of St. Augustine, we can conclude that when there is a lack of peace there is a lack of love. Why? Because virtue (ordered conduct) leads us to a happy life, virtue is nothing else than perfect love of God.

He writes, “For the fourfold division of virtue I regard as taken from four forms of love: *temperance* is love giving itself entirely to that which is loved; *fortitude* is love readily bearing all things for the sake of the loved object; *justice* is love serving only the loved object, and therefore ruling rightly; *prudence* is love distinguishing with wisdom between what hinders it and what helps it.” (On the Church and Morals, c. 15)

Another way of stating this is that order and peace begin from within, otherwise it is superficial, artificial, and intermittent. Our Lord teaches this in the negative form, “from the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, unchastity, theft, false witness, blasphemy. These are what defile a person...” (Mt 15:19) We cannot expect peace and order without converting our Hearts to Jesus Christ.

Mary plays an important role in living a fully ordered life. Christ knows this, which is why He leads us to her and her to us.

**WOMAN, BEHOLD, YOUR SON. [...] BEHOLD, YOUR MOTHER**

The Christian life consists in reproducing Jesus Christ in our souls. As St. Louis de Montfort teaches, the world received Jesus, by the power of the Holy Spirit through Mary. Therefore, the simple and profound way by which we can bring this about – conversion of hearts and peace – is through the Rosary.

Concerning troubled times and peace in the world, we

cannot help but consider the events that took place in Fatima. In fact, with the consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, we find ourselves in the midst of it.

Throughout the six apparitions of our Lady of Fatima to Blessed Jacinta, Blessed Francisco and Sister Lucia our Blessed Mother has always made the same request: “*Pray the Rosary every day.*”

We, Catholics, rightly call the Blessed Virgin Mary Queen of the Most Holy Rosary because the power of the Rosary manifests Mary’s great love and protection for all her children. Never will we be disappointed in asking anything from Mary through the recitation of the Holy Rosary. Our Queen wishes to draw us closer to Christ through this magnificent devotion, but maybe we just don’t pray it enough or with enough devotion. For, what miracles would happen if we did!

It is hard to overestimate the spiritual power of the Rosary which has been a staple of Catholic devotion since at least the eleventh century.

How many times we have been witnesses of profound conversions to the faith, after the prayer of the Holy Rosary! Countless times the Rosary has been the source of the correction of morals, and the growth in holiness of many, many souls. What most people seem to ignore, however, is that it is also a real protection from disaster and evil. And our Lady of Fatima repeatedly emphasizes this point:

In July 13, 1917 She says to the three little shepherds: “*Pray the Rosary in order to obtain peace.*”

In September 13 of the same year: “*Continue to pray the Rosary in order to obtain the end of the war.*”

And finally on October 13, she says: “*Continue to pray the Rosary every day. The war is going to end, and the soldiers will soon return to their homes.*”

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI has also said: “The Rosary is a spiritual ‘weapon’ in the battle against evil, against all violence, for peace in hearts, in families, in society and in the world.”

It cannot be emphasized enough that the seemingly repetitive prayer of the Rosary is not just rote prayer; it is meant to be a contemplation of the mysteries of the life of Christ from the point of view of His mother. Those who



**STATIONS OF THE CROSS**



The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation. The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station. At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete.

The Stations of the Cross are commonly found in churches as a series of 14 small icons or images. They can also appear in church yards arranged along paths. The stations are most commonly prayed during Lent on Wednesdays and Fridays, and especially on Good Friday, the day of the year upon which the events actually occurred.

## MASS INTENTION REQUESTS


**Note: We have now transitioned onto an online platform to accept Mass requests. From this time onward, we will no longer be accepting requests via email.**

The calendar is currently open for Mass intention requests for the months of March and April. We will open the book for Mass on April 1, 2022.

**Please follow the requirements listed below.**

Mass Intention request requirements:

- Donation of \$10 per Mass
- Limit of 1 individual Mass per week. Do not request more than 1 non-collective Mass in the same week.
- Each Mass may only have 2 names with a limit of 30 characters (including spaces) per Mass request.
- Please remember to note if the request is for someone living or deceased.
- Only one intention option chosen (see below table for available options).
- No changes can be made once the requests have been placed into the calendar.
- No holds or reservations will be accepted. No exceptions can be made.



### How To Request Mass using the Online Portal

In order to request a Mass Intention, please carefully follow the steps written on the page and also in further detail on our website page: [bit.ly/olop-mass-requests](http://bit.ly/olop-mass-requests)

1. Go to our online portal
2. Choose a Mass time to request. If you don't see a time listed, it is not available and a pending/approved request was already made.
3. Enter in all the details for the Mass request. Each individual Mass intention may only have up to 2 names

with a limit of 30 characters (including spaces) per Mass request.

4. Choose only one intention option to add onto the name(s) (see table below)
5. Submit your Mass request. This removes the time slot from the calendar, which prevents duplicate requests.
6. Clicking "Donate Now" will take you to our online Donation portal. You can also donate in person at the office or by mail. If you are donating by mail, please include your name, intention information, and phone number.
7. Once the request is received, our staff will double check for availability. Until the intention request is finalized by a confirmation reply email, the intention is not considered entered in the calendar. You will receive a call if there are any time conflicts or changes needed.

- Esther Sample, Health & Thanksgiving


