FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Our Lady of Guadalupe – Star of the New Evangelization

Dear Friends,

The United States Catholic Catechism for Adults speaks about the image of our Lady of Guadalupe as being imprinted upon us, it states: "As her image was imprinted on Juan Diego's tilma, so Mary becomes imprinted in the deepest recesses of the hearts of all who come to her."

I would like to consider some different aspects regarding the apparitions of our Blessed Mother to St. Juan Diego and the miraculous image that remained his the tilma.

Her Appearance

She said to Juan Diego, "Are you not in the hollow of my mantle, in the crossing of my arms? To say, "you are in the cross of my arms," speaks to the indigenous mentality that understands her to say, "You are in my heart! What else do you need?" Also, we have to remember that the Virgin of Guadalupe is a woman who has a ribbon tied around her waist, which means she is pregnant. The Virgin of Guadalupe brings Jesus, here. So when the virgin of Guadalupe says that you are in the hollow of my mantle she is telling you: that she places us there in her Son Jesus.

Her Face

As the indigenous people said when speaking about the image of the Virgin of Guadalupe say, "Her face is neither theirs (referring to the Spaniards) nor ours, but both." That is to say that to the extent we are united as brothers way we manifest her face, not ours. It is neither of them, nor of us, but of both of us—ours. In other words, to the extent that we are united in love, we manifest the very face of Jesus' love through the Virgin Mary of Guadalupe.

Her Words

The Virgin of Guadalupe says some of the most beautiful words and, as she usually does, she says them to a poor and simple one. Here are some of the things she said to Juan Diego,

Do not be afraid, here I have the honor, the joy of being your mother,

Am I not here who am your Mother?

Are you not in my shadow and under my protection?

Am I not your health?

Are you not on my lap and in my arms?

Do you need anything else?

Her message

She wants to stop the human sacrifices among the

indigenous people. She wantsthem to know that she understands them. She says to them, I understand you. Why? "Because I too was in front of a human sacrifice. I was before the cross of my Son. I know that it is to give up your Son so that all may be saved. I know it. I was in front of the cross, seeing my Son." And so she says to them, "no more human sacrifices. My Son is the only and eternal sacrifice." The indigenous people thought that human life had meaning and to the extent that their lives collaborated with the gods and was given to the gods, the universe would continue and the human being could subsist. The indigenous began his journey in this life, under the conviction that he was the son of the sun, with the consecration of procuring food for the cosmos by human sacrifice (literally speaking).

The imagery on the tilma of St. Juan Diego speak to this misguided notion of appeasing the gods. Notice that the stems of the flowers are born in the Virgin's mantle, which symbolizes heaven. What does this mean? That Mary brings new divine life to our hearts. Through her Son there is a heart transplant, a transfusion of blood that comes from God to mankind! She teaches the Aztecs that human sacrifices are not necessary. That it is not necessary to tear out hearts to feed the gods and maintain the cycle of life. Because God Himself, Creator of heaven and earth, gives Himself in sacrifice. He gives his heart in sacrifice for our salvation.

The joy of the Lord's presence through Mary can only be understood in a humble, simple heart, where God dwells and fills everything, nothing is missing, it is completely full, because it is the place of the encounter with the omnipotent God who shares everything, all His love and mercy—a God who gives His life for love of us. This is what both the indigenous people and the Spaniards grasped, and with them, the whole race, and an unprecedented conversion took place in the history of the Church.

Fray Toribio de Benavente, Motolinia, reported that by the year 1536 there were about 5,000,000 converts and by 1538 there were about 9,000,000! God heard the Bishop's prayer of intercession. The Almighty overflowed his mercy to his children, sending his own Mother, disciple and missionary of his love.

Between 1539 and 1540, Fray Juan de Zumárraga wrote to the king and emperor Charles V: "Here, from the Indies, perhaps God wants and has ordered that from here, the universal reformation should begin." On June 3, 1548, Fray



PARISH REGISTRATION

Are You a Registered Parishioner?

If you are over the age of 18 and attend Mass here regularly, we encourage you to register as a member of Our Lady of Peace parish.

Three main reasons why registering is important:

1. Make Sacrament prep easier when the time comes.

Infant baptisms, religious education registration, being a godparent/sponsor for baptisms or confirmations, and especially getting married (whether you are getting married at this parish, another parish, or having an international Catholic wedding) all involve record of parish participation. If you're not a registered parishioner, this will greatly delay the process.

2. Letters of Recommendation

Sometimes there are occasions where letters of recommendations are needed from your parish pastor (ie Catholic school enrollment, scholarships, godparent eligibility, etc.). If you're not registered, we cannot provide this letter to you or your family.

3. If we as a parish do not know who is out there, how can we serve the needs of all?

This includes single people or young families who may not see the need to register.

Anyone, regardless of where they live, is welcome to register at OLOP, if they regularly attend our parish.

Please note: there is a three (3) month waiting period from the date of registration before being considered a full-fledged registered parishioner. Any requests for pastor signatures on any forms, letters, or wedding preparation paperwork will not be processed within the 3 months.
