## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## A Christmas Letter

Dear Friends,

Merry Christmas!

I write this as a Christmas letter, in a particular way, to all of you who feel alone this Christmas. Perhaps you are separated from loved ones due to work or strife or death or merely drifting apart from relationships due to life's events. Maybe you are spending a holiday for the first time after a broken relationship or after the loss of a loved one or loneliness maybe the holiday suffering that you face, year in and year out. Whatever the case may be, I write this to you.

For those who feel alone, the Holiday moments can feel like a "Bleak Mid-Winter", even in places like Sunny California. The words of Christina Rosetti's 1872 poem can aptly describe this interior desolation, "In the bleak mid-winter, Frosty wind made moan; Earth stood hard as iron, Water like a stone;…" I want to express my care in writing this to you. I figure that sometimes a simple acknowledgment of the plight of others, that it is not unnoticed or thought about, can go a long way. I assure you of my thoughts and prayers. I also assure you that Christ understands. I assure you that Christ wore your shoes. He empties Himself of His great glory for us! He invites us to join His company. He makes Himself vulnerable and faces loneliness so we don't have to. God is with us!

So I say to you, do not let sadness seep in or take away your joy. We are here to spend Christmas with you and bring Christmas to you. Jesus is here for you to celebrate the best gathering and the greatest act of thanksgiving to God possible. We gather around the table in communion in the most united of ways. I am referring to a communion of belief and a communion of supernatural grace, not just a union of proximity. God drew and draws close to us.

This is not a consolation prize. As if to say, "well they don't have anywhere else to go for Christmas, so I might as well spend it at Church." No, not at all!

Listen to the some more of the above cited poem, "Our God, heaven cannot hold Him, Nor earth sustain, Heaven and earth shall flee away, When He comes to reign: In the bleak mid-winter A stable-place sufficed, The Lord God Almighty —Jesus Christ."

Spending the Holiday with Christ, with Him here at Mass or in Adoration or with friends in His name, is not a secondrate gathering. Actually, all other Christmas gatherings in the houses and homes of people around the world are a semblance of the gathering *par excellence* that takes place

within the Holy Mass. And what is the reason for this? Why is the mass and the gathering that takes place here at the Church to be held by you and by me as the epitome of Christmas gatherings, one unto which all others pale in comparison (and not the other way around)? Because of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ that is offered within the walls of the Church and upon the altar of Sacrifice. The Catholic Church is the New Bethlehem. Here we are brought together again in communion with God, by way of His sacrifice for us. Grace and personal union with God make us whole in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Our sacrifices, our sufferings, our burdens our brought to Bethlehem, which, as Fulton Sheen puts it, "was the cameo of Calvary." When we think about it this way, the Mass is a pretty incredible gift exchange and Christmas celebration. Christ wants us and all of our sacrifices and sufferings; He gives us Himself and His sacrifices and sufferings.

Listen to the final verse of Rosetti's poem, "What can I give Him, Poor as I am? —If I were a Shepherd, I would bring a lamb; If I were a Wise Man, I would do my part, —Yet what I can I give Him, —Give my heart." He is the one you long for and this Holiday time is a great time to remember this – even if it is prompted by feeling the bleakness of a midwinter time.

G.K. Chesteron, a lover of Christmas, quips, "The great majority of people will go on observing forms that cannot be explained; they will keep Christmas Day with Christmas gifts and Christmas benedictions; they will continue to do it; and some day suddenly wake up and discover why." ("On Christmas," *Generally Speaking*) And I would like to add that maybe the "lonely" will be the ones to inform them.

To everyone, please be assured of my personal prayers for you and your Christmas Season.

## PARISH REGISTRATION

#### Are You a Registered Parishioner?

If you are over the age of 18 and attend Mass here regularly, we encourage you to register as a member of Our Lady of Peace parish.

Three main reasons why registering is important:

#### 1. Make Sacrament prep easier when the time comes.

Infant baptisms, religious education registration, being a godparent/sponsor for baptisms or confirmations, and especially getting married (whether you are getting married at this parish, another parish, or having an international Catholic wedding) all involve record of parish participation. If you're not a registered parishioner, this will greatly delay the process.

2. Letters of Recommendation

Sometimes there are occasions where letters of recommendations are needed from your parish pastor (ie Catholic school enrollment, scholarships, godparent

eligibility, etc.). If you're not registered, we cannot provide this letter to you or your family.

#### 3. If we as a parish do not know who is out there, how can we serve the needs of all?

This includes single people or young families who may not see the need to register.

Please note: there is a three (3) month waiting period from the date of registration before being considered a fullfledged registered parishioner. Any requests for pastor signatures on any forms, letters, or wedding preparation paperwork will not be processed within the 3 months.
