FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

St. Juan Diego – A Humble Servant to the Humble Servant

Dear Friends,

Over the course of the first weeks of Advent, we have been hearing exclusively from the book of the Prophet Isaiah for our Old Testament readings. Amidst the destruction and suffering and sadness and captivity, a little bit like the way that we have felt during these past years of Covid – weary, isolated, disoriented. Isaiah offers a word of hope. God will come to the rescue of his people. She put an end to the bloody human sacrifice of the Aztecs and converted ten million natives in the next 10 years!

As we will hear during this Advent, "Though young men faint and grow weary, and youths stagger and fall, They that hope in the LORD will renew their strength, they will soar as with eagles' wings; They will run and not grow weary, walk and not grow faint." This last half of the book of Isaiah is often called the Book of Consolation because it speaks of comfort that will come to Israel through God's intervention.

This week, on December 9, we will celebrate the feast day of St. Juan Diego, I call to mind the words that Mary spoke to Juan Diego, whom she called to listen well and to be her humble instrument by establishing a chapel on the hill of Tepeyac just outside of Mexico City.

St. Juan Diego was born around 1474 in Cuauhtlitán in the neighborhood of Tlayácac, a region that belonged to the kingdom of Texcoco. Upon the arrival of the first missionaries this town was one of the first to receive the gospel and thus Juan Diego was one of the first to embrace the Catholic faith. He was baptized around the year 1524 and married Maria Lucia for the Catholic faith at that time when he was around 50 years old.

Maria Lucia died in 1529 just two years before the apparitions of the Virgin to Juan Diego. He was always very zealous in practicing the faith and went every Saturday and Sunday to Tlatelolco, a neighborhood in Mexico City, where he learned the faith and attended Mass. For this he had to leave his town very early in the morning and walk south until he reached the edge of the Tepeyac hill. It was on that road that he heard the voice of the Virgin calling him from Mount Tepeyac.

She said to him: "Listen, my son, my youngest, Juanito, where are you going?

Juan Diego explained to her with simplicity and confidencelike the humble do-that he was going to catechism and to attend Mass.

Therefore the Beautiful Lady told him: Littlest of my sons, know and understand that I am the Ever Virgin Mary,

Mother of the True God by whom you live: the Creator...Lord of heaven and earth. I ardently desire that a sanctuary be erected for me, that in it I may show and give my love, compassion, help and defense, for I am your merciful mother, to you, and to all of you, the inhabitants of this land and to the other lovers of mine who invoke me and trust me. Here I will hear their cries and remedy all of their miseries, difficulties and pains.

Then, when she addressed Juan and the concerns that he had about being this messenger for her we hear some very consoling and encouraging words: "Listen and understand, my humblest son. There is nothing to frighten and distress you. Do not let your heart be troubled, and let nothing upset you. Is it not I, your Mother, who is here? Are you not under my protection? Are you not, fortunately, in my care? Do not let your uncle's illness distress you. It is certain that he has already been cured. Go up to the hilltop, my son, where you will find flowers of various kinds. Cut them, and bring them into my presence."

St. Juan Diego's example is strikingly similar to that of the Blessed Virgin Mary herself. He was humble and prompt to respond to her request to **put forth all your effort** in carrying out her request. Because he conducted his life with humility Juan Diego was disposed for the activity of God in his life, putting aside his own affairs and becoming available to God's plan.

The more humble we are, the more glory we will give to God and the greater works we will accomplish with his power. For the humble know that they alone can do nothing, but with God all things are possible! With him nothing is impossible! As Our Lady sings in her Magnificat: God brings down the mighty from their thrones and exalts the humble.

And this is precisely one of Juan Diego's qualities, his humility, as today's first reading indicates. Consider that among you who have been called by God, there are not many wise men, not many mighty men, not many noble men, by human standards. For God has chosen the ignorant of this world to humble the wise, the weak of the world to shame the strong, the lowly and despised of the world, that is, the worthless, to bring to nothing those who are worthy, so that no one may boast before God.

Let us ask today through the intercession of Juan Diego for the grace to have a humble heart. The grace to trust in Him to do great things for His glory and the salvation of souls.
