FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Reclaiming the Ordinary - A Prudent Heart is a Discerning Heart

Dear Friends,

I would like for us to remain with Prudence for this week as well. We have considered prudence as a listening heart and we have looked at it in terms of communication. I would like to now reiterate its importance for discernment and that it is a virtue indicative of maturity.

According to Jesus Christ, the mature person is a person of discernment (“You will know them”) and caution (“Beware”). The first is part of prudence in its intellectual side; the second, part of prudence on the practical level. Hence, the mature person is a person of prudence, because without prudence there is no virtue whatsoever.

Prudence is defined by Aristotle as right discernment on what should be done (cf. Ethic, I. VI, c. 5; STh 2-2, 47, 2 sed vs.). If what is wanted to be done refers to a particular end (for e.g. the victory in a battle, the well-being of a town) prudence is particular. If it refers to the end of the whole life, then it is the intellectual and moral virtue which judges and it commands what should be done or to omit something in each case to act honestly.

The virtue of the prudence has been designated with the word: discretio that means election. It is related to the verb discernere, to discern. Discernment, meaning sound judgment (ea quae sunt ad finem), is the heart of prudence. In biblical Greek froneo: to meditate, to think, to project; fronesis: intelligence, discernment, good sense; fronomos: prudence, good sense.

Prudence is a virtue of the sound reason; it is a practical virtue, ordinate to a concrete action. It helps us to meditate and ponder the effects that can produce our words, our actions and behaviors. It is a point of reference to act with more conscience in front of the ordinary situations of the life.

In His sermon on the mount, the Lord speaks of “ravenous wolves,” an expression very similar to the one that Saint Peter will use to refer to the devil as a “roaring lion looking for [someone] to devour” (1 Pt 5:8). If the devil is a roaring lion, his minions are wolves.

To devour is his office and his hobby. Sooner or later, the immature will end up as victims of his jaws.

To be devoured means to be converted into one of them; the immature are eaten by the wolves when they become like them in vice, in their “worldliness”: they devour the life of grace which is like eating out their hearts. In the face of this, Jesus demands two attitudes: discernment and to be careful. (Cf., Mt 7:15-20)

So, the virtue of prudence, helps us to discern well. It is to use reason to make decisions and to not be ruled by the passions or emotion. Prudence requires an individual to order actions to the good and the ultimate good for mankind is God.

Prudence is “right reason applied to action,” as stated above (Article 2). Hence that which is the chief act of reason in regard to action must needs be the chief act of prudence. Now there are three such acts. The first is “to take counsel,” which belongs to discovery, for counsel is an act of inquiry, as stated above (I-II, 14, 1). The second act is “to judge of what one has discovered,” and this is an act of the speculative reason. But the practical reason, which is directed to action, goes further, and its third act is “to command,” which act consists in applying to action the things counselled and judged. And since this act approaches nearer to the end of the practical reason, it follows that it is the chief act of the practical reason, and consequently of prudence.

This is what St. Thomas would call the exercise of the supernatural virtue of prudence. Here is another way putting it: “The steps of prudence, as St Thomas outlines them: deliberate well on the factors involved, judge wisely regarding the best means to the end in view—God’s will for you in this choice, in view of eternal life—and then do it. When you follow this approach with prayer and under wise guidance, you have what you need to find God’s will.” (Cf., Summa theologiae, 1.2, q.57, a.4, ad3.)

So here are some practical steps that can be employed in living a spirit of discernment or prudence. Prayer, review, choice, execution, examining the thing afterwards. So the first thing we need to do about a decision, small or large, is to pray. Ask for the Holy Spirit to enlighten you heart and mind. Then one reviews the situation and the factors that are involved in the choice. You make your best decision, it may not be the perfect decision, but it is our best decision considering all of the factors involved. Once the decision has been made, execute it and follow it through with ease. Do not be impatient about it or anxious, but follow through. Then review the decision at the end of the day. If it was a mistake, try to correct it and do better next time. If it was a good decision, give thanks to God for his protection and guidance. Just simply review things later on and in all humility confirm or correct the decision.

May we obtain the grace to respond with greater discernment in our lives rather than just reacting. May our Blessed Mother obtain for us the grace of Prudence.

LENT: FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older.

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

From its earliest days, the Church has urged the baptized and the catechumens to observe the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer as a preparation for the celebration of Easter. Failure to observe individual days of penance is not considered serious, but failure to observe any penitential days at all or a substantial number of such days must be considered serious.

During Lent, the Church encourages attendance at daily Mass, self-imposed times of fasting, and generosity to local, national, and worldwide programs of sharing.

I ask it by all your care to protect the Sacred Child and His Immaculate Mother during your second journey, when you were ordered to return to your own country. I ask it by your peaceful life in Nazareth where you met with so many joys and sorrows.

I ask it by your great distress when the adorable Child was lost to you and His Mother for three days. I ask it by your joy at finding Him in the Temple, and by the comfort you found at Nazareth, while living in the company of the Child Jesus. I ask it by the wonderful submission He showed in His obedience to you.

I ask it by the perfect love and conformity you showed in accepting the Divine order to depart from this life, and from the company of Jesus and Mary. I ask it by the joy which filled your soul, when the Redeemer of the world, triumphant over death and hell, entered into the possession of His kingdom and led you into it with special honors.




