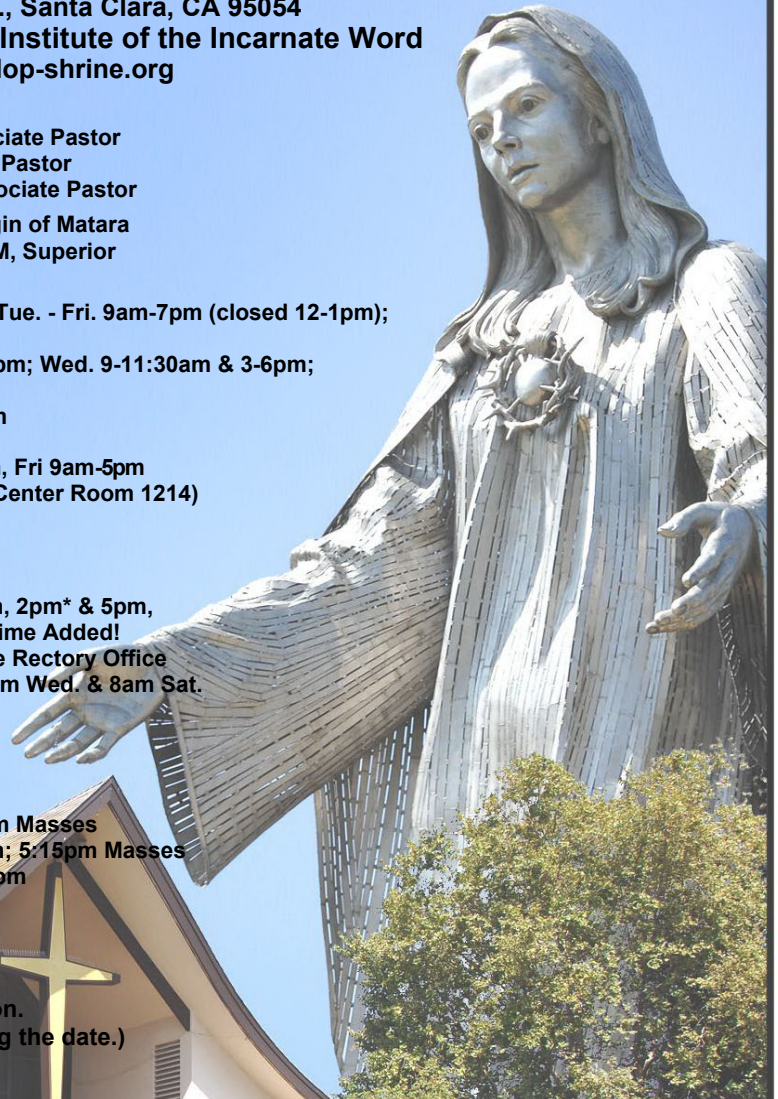

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today we begin Holy Week which has been called the Major Week of Christianity. During the past three Sundays we have been questioned by the Gospels about our faith in Jesus, about accepting Him as the promised Messiah and King or rejecting Him.

The mysteries we celebrate throughout this week which begins with the *Hosanna!* of Palm Sunday and culminates in the *Crucify Him!* of Good Friday allow us to deepen those considerations in several regards. It is quite difficult to imagine two such contrasting events in such a short span of time. Is there anything that might link these two so seemingly contradictory events? Yes, there is: "Jesus' entry into Jerusalem manifested the coming of the kingdom that the King-Messiah was going to accomplish by the Passover of his Death and Resurrection." (CCC 560)

There is an important aspect in Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Jesus enters acclaimed as king, but He enters riding a very simple colt. St. Matthew tells us the reason of this: *This took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the Prophet: Tell the daughter of Zion [Jerusalem], look your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey...* (21:4) The prophecy was pronounced by Zechariah (9:9ff,) but he says something more: *I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war horse from Jerusalem; and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall command peace to the nations; his dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth.* This means universal dominion with universal peace. Hence he will be a king of peace.

This reference takes us into a very deep aspect of the mystery of Christ's kingship. To understand it correctly we need to recall what was the praxis of enthroning a king in ancient Israel. The process had three steps: designation, demonstration and confirmation. First the candidate was somehow designated (e.g. by lots or by popular acclamation like here;) then the designated candidate had to demonstrate that he had the conditions to be a king, namely his ability, through some important deed (usually a military feat). Once this was done, he was confirmed in the position; hence, he was enthroned as king.

In the case of Jesus, He had chosen a way of entering into the royal city so that Zechariah's prophecy was fulfilled, namely that He is a King of Peace. Instead of being designated by God (cf. Ps 2,) the people acclaimed Him. But, could He perform something that would eventually show that He is truly a King of Peace? Would He be able to keep the inner peace, in His own heart, and the outer peace, with those who would offend and mistreat Him?

He answers these questions through the mystery of His Passion and Death, showing that He certainly has the kingly conditions. Jesus points that out specifically in the Garden of Gethsemane: *Jesus said to him [Peter], 'Put your sword back into its place; for all who take the sword will perish by the sword. Do you think that I cannot appeal to my Father, and He will at once send me more than twelve legions of angels? But how then would the scriptures be fulfilled, that it must happen in this way?'* (Mt 26:52-54) Jesus renounces to every sort of reaction that might contradict His condition as King of Peace and accepts whatever God the Father had disposed in His plan (cf. second reading). And He keeps this disposition throughout the entire Passion.

There is still something more. Jesus acts in such a way that He fulfills the Father's plan. To say it another way, He complies with God's justice. Justice is done to the Promise. And this is highlighted by Jesus as well: *"Have you come out with swords and clubs to arrest me as though I were a bandit? Day after day I sat in the temple teaching, and you did not arrest me. But all this has taken place so that the Scriptures of the Prophets may be fulfilled."* (Mt 26:55-56)

In conclusion, Jesus is King of Peace and also King of Justice. That is why the letter to the Hebrews says: *This Melchisedek, king of Salem... He is first, by translation of his name, king of righteousness, and then he is also king of Salem, that is, king of peace.* (Heb 7:1-2) Because, as Isaiah says, *the fruit of justice will be peace* (32:17.)

Let us, therefore, open our hearts and enthrone in them Jesus as our supreme King, and let us allow Him to rule on our lives, if we truly want peace. May the Queen of Peace lead us into His Kingdom.

The parish has cheat sheets set up near the confessional on how to make a good confession and has expanded confession hours as well. Please make plans to come to confession during Lent and spread the word of this special outreach of mercy to those you know.

24 More Hours of Confession Added Each Week!

Our Normal Confession schedule is posted on the cover page of the bulletin but we have added an additional six hours of confessions here at Our Lady of Peace during Lent: **Each Tuesday to Friday during Lent, you may come to confession between 11am to 2pm or 4pm to 7pm.**

This outreach is called "The Light is On For You," and is an effort to highlight the importance of the Sacrament of Confession in the life of Catholics and to make it as easy as possible for every Catholic to come or to return to this great source of God's mercy and healing love.

Please make plans to come yourself and please invite others take advantage of this great opportunity to be reconciled and begin anew your journey in faith this Lent.

The Divine Mercy Novena

Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy which would begin on **Good Friday**. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena, saving for the last day the most difficult intention of all, the lukewarm and indifferent of whom He said:

"These souls cause Me more suffering than any others; it was from such souls that My soul felt the most revulsion in the Garden of Olives. It was on their account that I said: 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass Me by.' The last hope of salvation for them is to flee to My Mercy."

In her diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her:

"On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy ... On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

The different souls prayed for on each day of the novena are:

- DAY 1 (Good Friday) - All mankind, especially sinners
- DAY 2 (Holy Saturday) - The souls of priests and religious
- DAY 3 (Easter Sunday) - All devout and faithful souls
- DAY 4 (Easter Monday) - Those who do not believe in Jesus and those who do not yet know Him
- DAY 5 (Easter Tuesday) - The souls of separated brethren
- DAY 6 (Easter Wednesday) - The meek and humble souls and the souls of children
- DAY 7 (Easter Thursday) - The souls who especially venerate and glorify Jesus' mercy
- DAY 8 (Easter Friday) - The souls who are detained in purgatory;
- DAY 9 (Easter Saturday) - The souls who have become lukewarm.

During the Solemn Novena leading to Divine Mercy Sunday, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy should be offered each day for the day's intentions.

From Good Friday (April 18) to Easter Saturday (April 26) the novena will be prayed in the Church at 3PM.

**Thousands to Gather for Canonization of Blessed John Paul II on
April 27, 2014 Santa Clara, CA USA-March 7, 2014**

*On April 27, 2014, the man who canonized more saints than any other Pope
in modern history will be higher in heaven when he himself becomes "Saint John Paul II."*

April 27, 2014 Santa Clara, CA – His Excellency, Patrick J. McGrath, Bishop of San Jose will dedicate a beautiful replica 7' tall bronze statue of John Paul II to be erected on April 27, 2014 at Our Lady of Peace Shrine. Invitations have been mailed to clergy and religious throughout central California and posters are being distributed to all parishes in the Dioceses of San Jose, Oakland, Monterey, and San Francisco. Fr. Gustavo Nieto, IVE, Pastor of Our Lady of Peace Church is opening the doors of his parish to everyone because, "It is an honor to bring home such a marvelous sculpted image of Saint John Paul the Great. We do it not only to honor him but also as a proof of gratitude and as an expression of love for his teachings, for his paternal care, for his exemplary and tender devotion to Mary, for his tireless missionary endeavors, and ultimately for his inspiration to live the spirit of the beatitudes in our daily lives."



Dedication and Installation

Prior to the Dedication his Excellency Bishop Patrick J. McGrath will preside a special outdoor Divine Mercy Mass at 2pm. Because Our Lady of Peace Church and Shrine draws attendees from throughout Northern and Central California, seating and standing room for several thousand will be available to all who wish to participate in this memorable event. A full day of activities includes: Confessions from 7:00 am to 9:00 pm, a Rosary procession after the dedication ceremony. The Shrine's Library Open House will take place from 4:00 pm until 7:00 pm. A reception will follow for all attendees. Also on this occasion, videos on the life and canonization of John Paul II will be viewed on our 25' movie screen at the Family Learning Center. Admittance is free.

Relic

Our Parish is very blessed to have a first class relic of our son-to-be-saint John Paul II (containing pieces of his hair) which will be exposed for public veneration and prayer. Holy cards with Saint John Paul II's image will be given to those in attendance.

The Statue

The original statue sculpted by Albano Poli of Verona was first on display in the atrium of the Papal Basilica of St. Paul (in 2008) before going to its final destination, the monumental Cross of the Third Millennium in Coquimbo, Chile. The sculptor has designed the Pope wearing the same miter and the same chasuble donated to the Cross of the Third Millennium foundation. In his left hand he is holding the crucifix upon which he often leant, while his right hand is stretched out to bless the crowd. The statue, which is over two meters high, was blessed on October 15, 2008 by the Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI during his general audience in St. Peter's Square. In December 2010, Mr. Poli exhibited a copy of the bronze sculpture of John Paul II at Palazzo dei Mutilati (Palace of War Cripples) in Verona on the occasion of a photographic exhibit about the Pope.

The Artist Albano Poli

Albano Poli, born in Verona August 2, 1935, attended the Napoleone Nani Art School run by Maestro Pino Casarini and founded the atelier Progetto Arte Poli in 1953. The atelier is an authentic "renaissance" workshop where each creation - stained glasses, mosaics, frescoes, renovation projects, bas-relief, full-relief - is a unique jewel in itself. His contributions to the restoration, renovation and renewal of many historical buildings merited mentions and awards: in June 2009 H.E. Cardinal Bertone invested Albano Poli as Knight of the Pontifical Equestrian Order of St. Gregory the Great for his artistic works in The Papal Basilica of St Paul outside the Walls in Rome.
