FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Easter! It is my prayerful desire that your souls may overflow with joy because, as Pope Francis said: "Love has triumphed, mercy has been victorious!"

During the Easter Vigil we heard the words from chapter one of the Book of Genesis: *Fiat lux; faciamus hominem* (Let there be light; let us make man) and on this Easter morning those words find their fullest meaning: that *light* is the new light which will never fade; that *man* is the new man created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness. (Eph. 4:24)

Indeed, Easter is the feast of the new creation. Jesus is risen and dies no more. This is why the early Church writer, Tertullian, could boldly affirm: "Rest assured, flesh and blood, through Christ you have gained your place in heaven and in the Kingdom of God" (CCL II, 994). Yes! In the mystery of Christ's death and resurrection all is redeemed, and everything becomes once more perfectly good, according to God's original plan.

On Holy Saturday as we pass the light from the Paschal candle to our candles we hear this beautiful proclamation: *May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds!* How true and profound these words sound on Easter night! This light represents the light that Christ brought to us, the light of truth and the fire of love that transform man's being. The liturgy wants to demonstrate that the night on the Mount of Olives, the solar eclipse of Jesus' passion and death, the night of the grave had all passed. Now it is the first day once again – creation is beginning anew. *Let there be light*, says God, *and there was light*. Jesus rises from the grave. Therefore, we need to live with the firm conviction that life is stronger than death. Good is stronger than evil. Love is stronger than hate. Truth is stronger than lies. The darkness of the previous days is driven away the moment Jesus rises from the grave and himself becomes God's pure light. (cf. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, 2012)

Also during the Easter season you will see the Easter candle being lit during Mass. I invite you to reflect on this symbol that most of the time goes unnoticed and yet silently teaches us an important lesson. The light of the Easter candle is a light that lives from sacrifice. The candle shines inasmuch as it is burnt up. It gives light, inasmuch as it gives itself.

In this regard I am reminded of certain passages of the Encyclical *Lumen Fidei* where we read: "The light of Christ shines, as in a mirror, upon the face of Christians; as it spreads, it comes down to us, so that we too can share in that vision and reflect that light to others, in the same way that, in the Easter liturgy, the light of the paschal candle lights countless other candles. Faith is passed on, we might say, by contact, from one person to another, just as one candle is lighted from another." (cf. 37)

These words of the Holy Father present to us once more the mystery of the vocation of every baptized person. They express the hope that the new life which we receive as a gift, the most holy night of the Easter Vigil should grow to its fullest, bringing abundant fruits of love, joy and peace, the fruits of eternal life.

Let me finish with a line of the prayer to our Lady that Pope Francis includes in *Evangelii Gaudium*: "Obtain for us a new ardor of the resurrection." As we sing the Easter Sequence "*Scimus Christum surrexisse a mortuis verè*" – let us reaffirm our conviction in the fact that Christ has truly risen from the dead.

Let us pray to the Lord at this time that He may grant us to experience the joy of his light; let us pray that we ourselves may become bearers of his light, and that through us, Christ's radiant face may enter our family, our parish, our world (cf. *Lumen Gentium*, 1).

My prayerful good wishes for a happy and spiritually enriching season of Easter to all. Happy Easter!

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul, and divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind,

168 HOURS in a week. It takes ~336 people to keep adoration

going 24/7, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of 411 people. Will you be among the few?

Perpetual adoration is forever, but one's life changes over time. Don't be afraid to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.

The Divine Mercy Novena

Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy which would begin on **Good Friday**. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena, saving for the last day the most difficult intention of all, the lukewarm and indifferent of whom He said:

"These souls cause Me more suffering than any others; it was from such souls that My soul felt the most revulsion in the Garden of Olives. It was on their account that I said: 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass Me by.' The last hope of salvation for them is to flee to My Mercy."

In her diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her:

"On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy ... On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

The different souls prayed for on each day of the novena are:

- DAY 1 (Good Friday) - All mankind, especially sinners
- DAY 2 (Holy Saturday) - The souls of priests and religious
- DAY 3 (Easter Sunday) - All devout and faithful souls
- DAY 4 (Easter Monday) - Those who do not believe in Jesus and those who do not yet know Him
- DAY 5 (Easter Tuesday) - The souls of separated brethren
- DAY 6 (Easter Wednesday) - The meek and humble souls and the souls of children
- DAY 7 (Easter Thursday) - The souls who especially venerate and glorify Jesus' mercy
- DAY 8 (Easter Friday) - The souls who are detained in purgatory;
- DAY 9 (Easter Saturday) - The souls who have become lukewarm.

During the Solemn Novena leading to Divine Mercy Sunday, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy should be offered each day for the day's intentions.

From Good Friday (April 18) to Easter Saturday (April 26) the novena will be prayed in the Church at 3PM.



**Thousands to Gather for Canonization of Blessed John Paul II on
April 27, 2014 Santa Clara, CA USA-March 7, 2014**

*On April 27, 2014, the man who canonized more saints than any other Pope
in modern history will be higher in heaven when he himself becomes "Saint John Paul II."*

April 27, 2014 Santa Clara, CA – His Excellency, Patrick J. McGrath, Bishop of San Jose will dedicate a beautiful replica 7' tall bronze statue of John Paul II to be erected on April 27, 2014 at Our Lady of Peace Shrine. Invitations have been mailed to clergy and religious throughout central California and posters are being distributed to all parishes in the Dioceses of San Jose, Oakland, Monterey, and San Francisco. Fr. Gustavo Nieto, IVE, Pastor of Our Lady of Peace Church is opening the doors of his parish to everyone because, "It is an honor to bring home such a marvelous sculpted image of Saint John Paul the Great. We do it not only to honor him but also as a proof of gratitude and as an expression of love for his teachings, for his paternal care, for his exemplary and tender devotion to Mary, for his tireless missionary endeavors, and ultimately for his inspiration to live the spirit of the beatitudes in our daily lives."

Dedication and Installation

Prior to the Dedication his Excellency Bishop Patrick J. McGrath will preside a special outdoor Divine Mercy Mass at 2pm. Because Our Lady of Peace Church and Shrine draws attendees from throughout Northern and Central California, seating and standing room for several thousand will be available to all who wish to participate in this memorable event. A full day of activities includes: Confessions from 7:00 am to 9:00 pm, a Rosary procession after the dedication ceremony. The Shrine's Library Open House will take place from 4:00 pm until 7:00 pm. A reception will follow for all attendees. Also on this occasion, videos on the life and canonization of John Paul II will be viewed on our 25' movie screen at the Family Learning Center. Admittance is free.



Relic

Our Parish is very blessed to have a first class relic of our son-to-be-saint John Paul II (containing pieces of his hair) which will be exposed for public veneration and prayer. Holy cards with Saint John Paul II's image will be given to those in attendance.

The Statue

The original statue sculpted by Albano Poli of Verona was first on display in the atrium of the Papal Basilica of St. Paul (in 2008) before going to its final destination, the monumental Cross of the Third Millennium in Coquimbo, Chile. The sculptor has designed the Pope wearing the same miter and the same chasuble donated to the Cross of the Third Millennium foundation. In his left hand he is holding the crucifix upon which he often leant, while his right hand is stretched out to bless the crowd. The statue, which is over two meters high, was blessed on October 15, 2008 by the Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI during his general audience in St. Peter's Square. In December 2010, Mr. Poli exhibited a copy of the bronze sculpture of John Paul II at Palazzo dei Mutilati (Palace of War Cripples) in Verona on the occasion of a photographic exhibit about the Pope.

The Artist Albano Poli

Albano Poli, born in Verona August 2, 1935, attended the Napoleone Nani Art School run by Maestro Pino Casarini and founded the atelier Progetto Arte Poli in 1953. The atelier is an authentic "renaissance" workshop where each creation - stained glasses, mosaics, frescoes, renovation projects, bas-relief, full-relief - is a unique jewel in itself. His contributions to the restoration, renovation and renewal of many historical buildings merited mentions and awards: in June 2009 H.E. Cardinal Bertone invested Albano Poli as Knight of the Pontifical Equestrian Order of St. Gregory the Great for his artistic works in The Papal Basilica of St Paul outside the Walls in Rome.
