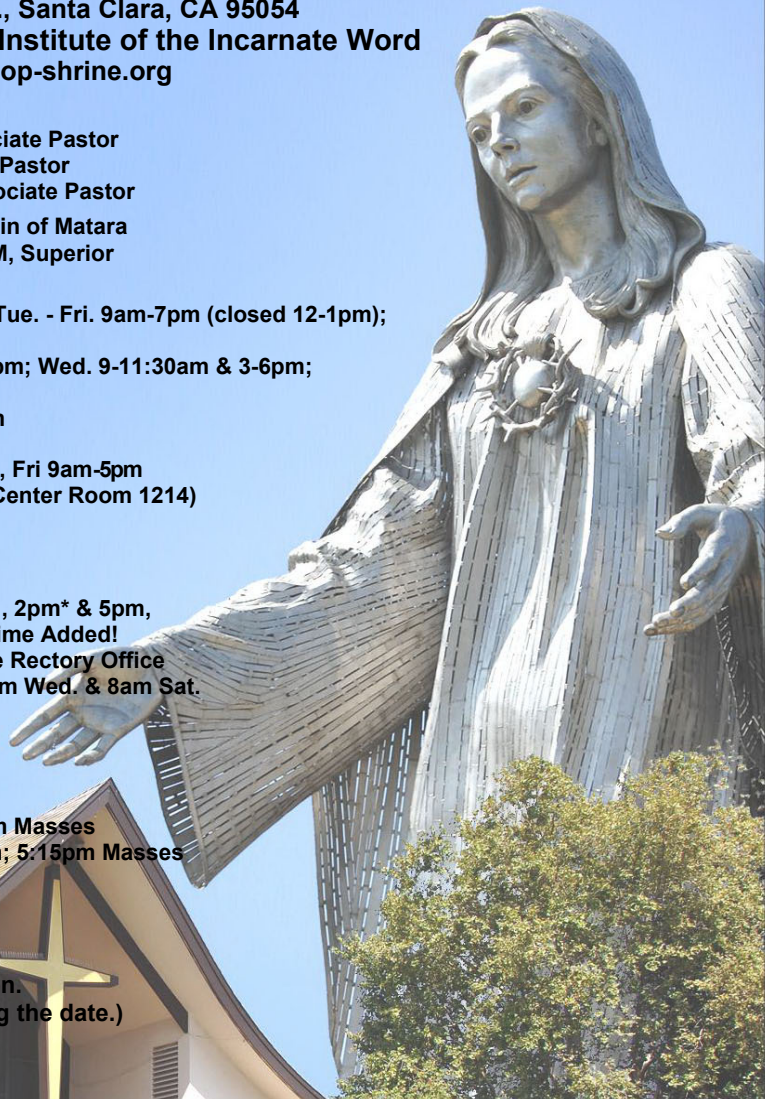

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

It still reverberating in us the joy of last Sunday. My deep gratitude to all for participating, your presence made the occasion even more special.

The Holy Father in his apostolic exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium* wrote: "Christ's Resurrection is not an event of the past; it contains a vital power which has permeated this world." (276) Therefore, this Third Sunday of Easter, I'd like to consider some of the effects of our Lord's Resurrection.

From that first Easter Day on the Resurrection of our Lord gave us two main benefits:

1. Our future corporeal resurrection. We are taught that *as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead* (1 Cor 15:21). So this tells us that as He triumphed over death, so we must triumph. It bids us to look forward to the new life, not back to the wasted and fallen years. His Resurrection gives us hope, for the action of Christ are not merely examples that we must strive to copy, but they are still more importantly the very power by which we get grace to overcome and to attain our final reward.

This leads me to the second effect of our Lord's Resurrection.

2. Our present spiritual resurrection: *He was put to death for our trespasses and raised for our justification* (Rom 4:25). It is then evident that justification is the resurrection of souls, who are spiritually dead by sin, dead to the life of grace. This is of capital importance for our spiritual life, to the point that Saint Thomas says that: "The good of grace in one is greater than the good of nature in the whole universe." (*ST I-II*, 113, 9, 2).

It is sanctifying grace that makes us *partakers of the divine nature* (2 Pt 1:4). As theologians say, it is participation in the divine nature itself. *And we were raised up with him* (Eph 2:6), becoming "by grace what He is by nature," (St. Cyril of Alexandria) children of God (cf. Rom 8:16), brethren of Christ. Jesus Christ is the *first-born among many brethren* (Rom 8:29), and therefore, we are co-heirs with Him, *heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ* (Rom 8:17). Moreover, along with grace we receive the instilled virtues and the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

The Resurrection of our Lord teaches us that there is nothing too far gone so that souls may be saved; "there are no hopeless cases; there are no lost sheep that cannot be found; no lost coins that cannot be recovered to rejoice the finder and her neighbors; no prodigals beyond the hope of the embrace of the Father and the banquet of the fatted calf." (Arch. F. Sheen)

And so in conclusion, the thought I would give to you is that no matter how hopeless things seem to be, there is still hope, for Christ is the Resurrection and the Life. "Let us not flee from the Resurrection of Jesus, let us never give up, come what will. May nothing inspire more than his life, which impels us onwards!" (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 3)

In the Easter Sequence we proclaim: "*Surrexit Christus spes mea: praecedet vos in Galileam.*" Indeed, He goes before us and He accompanies us along the paths of the world. He is our hope.

So this is the invitation which I address to everyone: "Let us accept the grace of Christ's Resurrection! Let us be renewed by God's mercy, let us be loved by Jesus, let us enable the power of his love to transform our lives too; and let us become agents of this mercy." (Pope Francis, Easter Sunday 2013)

During this Month of Mary, I invite you to deepen your devotion to our Blessed Mother and to experience her maternal care and closeness to you. Pray the Rosary, strive to imitate our Lady's virtues and trust in this beautiful Mother of Mercy. May this be really a month of prayer with Mary!
