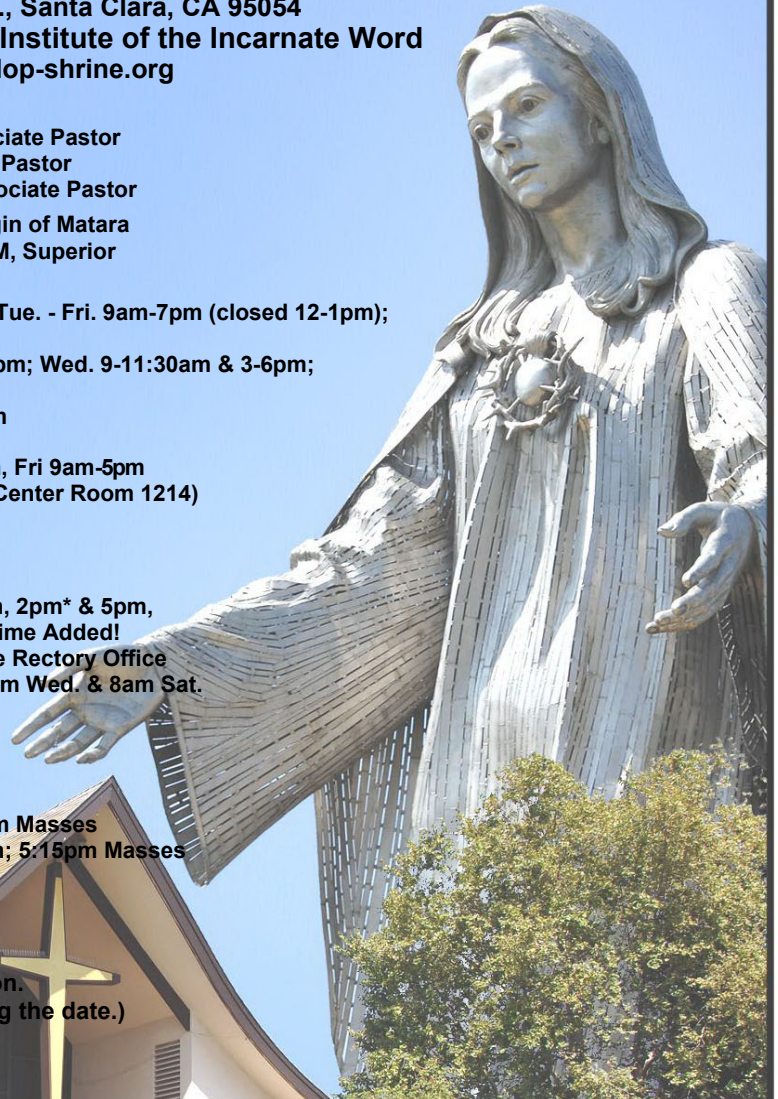

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

On this Fifth Sunday of Easter I'd like to refer to yet another effect of our Lord's Resurrection: the fact that in Him we are born to a new life.

The Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen in his book *The Finding of the Lost* wrote: "The Resurrection of Our Lord was not the resumption of an old life; it was the beginning of a new life...the world will be saved not by social recovery, but by re-birth – re-birth from dead by the Power of Divinity in Christ... that is, we must not reconstruct our old life, we must rise to new life."

The New Law brings us to the New Man by essence, Jesus Christ Himself, *that he might create in himself one new man* (Eph 2:15) and the new man by participation, namely, all those who are incorporated into Jesus Christ through grace: *and put on the new nature, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness* (Eph 4:24). The new man is opposed to the *old man which...is corrupt through deceitful lusts* (Eph 4:22).

The new man is the "interior man," *strengthened with might through his Spirit* (Eph 3:16). The new man is also identified with the *spiritual man* (1 Cor 2:15). He is the man who sings the "new song." "This new song" –says St. Augustine– "does not belong to the old man. Only the new man learns it: the man restored from his fallen condition through God's grace, and now sharing in the new covenant, that is, the kingdom of heaven. To it all our love now aspires and sings a new song. *Let us sing a new song not with our lips but with our lives...*"

Jesus Christ, the supreme and eternal New Man, wants us to assimilate His doctrine, to imitate His examples, to unite ourselves wholeheartedly with His Person and to frequent His sacraments. The modern immanentist conceptions that propose a "new man" – who is no more than a human wretch – detest Jesus by denying man the supernatural dimension of grace. The only thing authentically new that there is, has been, and will be in the world is Jesus Christ who "brought all [possible] novelty, by bringing Himself..." (Saint Irenaeus)

Therefore, I take this opportunity to invite you to live your "baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ," (Pope Francis, 01/24/14) which means, letting Christ take possession of our lives and transform them. This transformation cannot be enacted unless we approach to the fountain of grace: Christ Himself.

And as I write these lines it comes to my mind the words of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI during his apostolic visit to the US: "Through the surpassing power of Christ's grace, entrusted to frail human ministers, the Church is constantly *reborn* and each of us is given the hope of a *new beginning*...To a great extent, the renewal of the Church in America and throughout the world depends on the renewal of the practice of Penance and the growth in holiness which that sacrament both inspires and accomplishes." (04/17/2008)

"Accept the risen Jesus into your life. Even if you have been far away, take a small step towards Him: He awaits you with open arms." (Pope Francis, @Pontifex 05/31/13)

Precisely today in which we commemorate the 28th anniversary of St. John Paul II's Encyclical *Dominum et Vivificantem* (The Lord and Giver of Life) I'd like to quote few words that make reference to the renewal we have been talking about: "For only the Holy Spirit 'convinces concerning sin,' in order to restore what is good in man and in the world: in order to 'renew the face of the earth.' Therefore, He purifies from everything that 'disfigures' man, from 'what is unclean'; He heals even the deepest wounds of human existence; He changes the interior dryness of souls, transforming them into the fertile fields of grace and holiness. What is 'hard He softens,' what is 'frozen He warms,' what is 'wayward He sets anew' on the paths of salvation." (67)

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

The Eucharist is the actual body, blood, soul, and divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. By adoring the Eucharist we are reminded in a very tangible way of God's love for humanity and his promise to mankind,

168 HOURS in a week. It takes ~336 people to keep adoration

going 24/7, and another 75 adorers as substitutes. That is a total of 411 people. Will you be among the few?

Perpetual adoration is forever, but one's life changes over time. Don't be afraid to commit to adoration, even if you might have to change your commitment in the future.

May: Month of Mary

Why does Mary have a special role in helping us?

As the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary has a unique position among the saints, indeed, among all creatures. She is exalted, yet still one of us.

Redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son and united to Him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of being the Mother of the Son of God, by which account she is also the beloved daughter of the Father and the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this gift of sublime grace she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth. At the same time, however, because she belongs to the offspring of Adam she is one with all those who are to be saved.

Mary embraces God's will and freely chooses to cooperate with God's grace, thereby fulfilling a crucial role in God's plan of salvation. Throughout the centuries, the Church has turned to the Blessed Virgin in order to come closer to Christ. Many forms of piety toward the Mother of God developed that help bring us closer to her Son. In these devotions to Mary, "while the Mother is honored, the Son, through whom all things have their being and in whom it has pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell, is rightly known, loved and glorified and . . . all His commands are observed."³³ The Church honors her as the Mother of God, looks to her as a model of perfect discipleship, and asks for her prayers to God on our behalf.

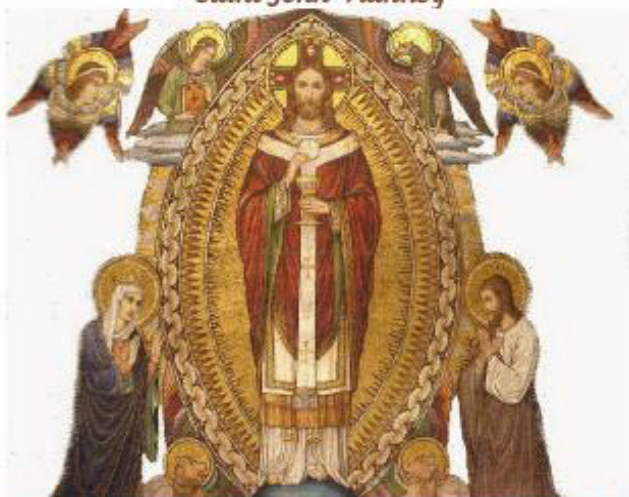

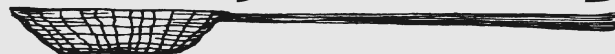

News You Can Use

"Mary and the Carmelite Mystics"

In the extensive writing about the Carmelite mystics there is, I think one major lacuna. Not nearly enough attention has been given to the place of Mary in the mystical journey. On its coming to Europe in the mid-13th century, the Carmelite Order developed over a period of about 300 years several images of the Virgin. Firstly, she was Patron. The hermits chose her on Mount Carmel as their Patron by the medieval symbolism of dedicating their first church to her. Henceforth they would serve her as a feudal Lady, and she would protect them as her vassals. The second image developed was Mother. The Lady of the Order was also its Mother. Thirdly, the idea of Sister developed. The Brothers of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, to use the ancient title of the Order, realized that their Patron and Mother was also Sister. Finally, the Carmelites focused on Mary as Virgin, but not so much in terms of chastity or physical integrity, but as the Virgin of the Most Pure Heart. Mary was the ideal fulfilment of the programmatic aim of The Institute of the First Monks, "to offer to God a heart holy and pure from all actual stain of sin."

But behind all these four images of Mary – Patron, Mother, Sister and Virgin of the Most Pure Heart – there is a deeper reality: Mary is the gentle, loving presence for Carmelites. But she is more: she is the Teacher and Guide of the mystics. This is an area seldom averted to by authors on the Carmelite mystics, be they from the Order or not.
